COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This interactive course is designed to provide an in-depth and multidisciplinary perspective on civilian-based movements and campaigns that defend and obtain basic rights and justice around the world with the use of nonviolent tactics and strategies.

In this moderated course, we will look at issues of political power, effectiveness of nonviolent resistance, the role of skills in civil resistance, strategies and tactics, phenomenon of backfire, and dilemma actions. We will also consider themes such as gender dynamics in civil resistance, anti-corruption movements, nonviolent struggles against exploitive industries, violent flank in civil resistance and political transitions.
