

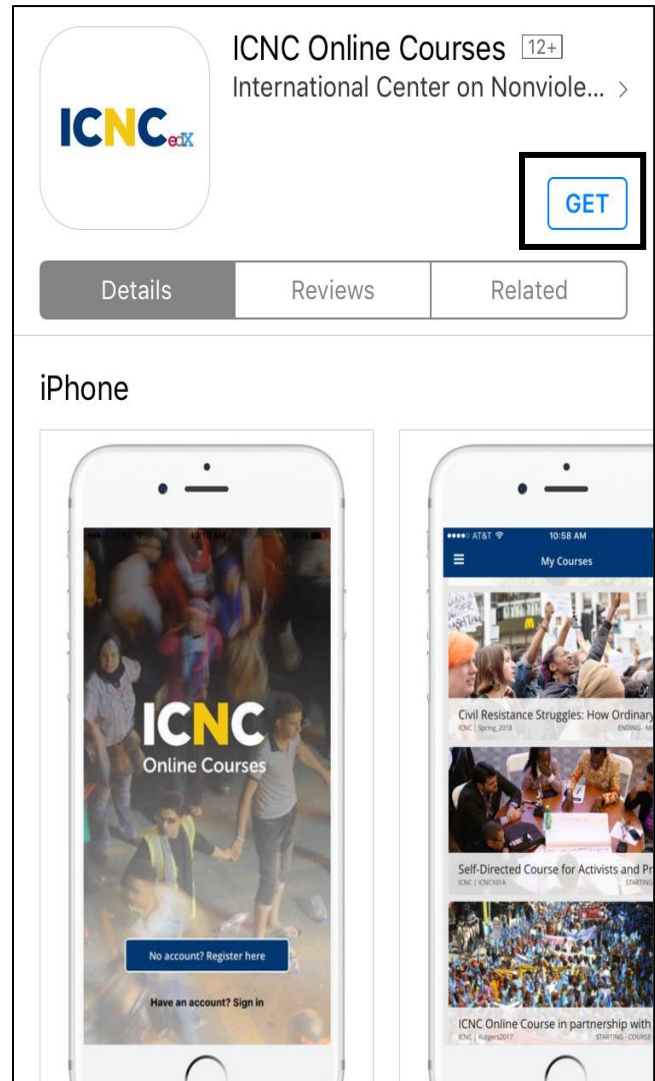

I. **Downloading the ICNC app**

- To download the ICNC app, type “**ICNC Online Courses**” into the App Store. Click on the ICNC image and click on “**Get**” to start downloading the app.



II. Registration

- Do you already have an account with ICNC Online Courses? If so, click on **“Have an account? Sign in”** and enter your email address and password.
- If you have **not** set up an account with ICNC Online Courses, please follow these instructions:
- On the ICNC mobile app homepage, tap on **“No account? Register here.”**



- Fill out all of the required fields shown in the screenshot below. You can fill out fields by tapping inside each registration field and typing in your answer. For your username, ICNC recommends using “**first name.last name**”, so that other users can easily identify who you are. For example: “**John.Smith**”

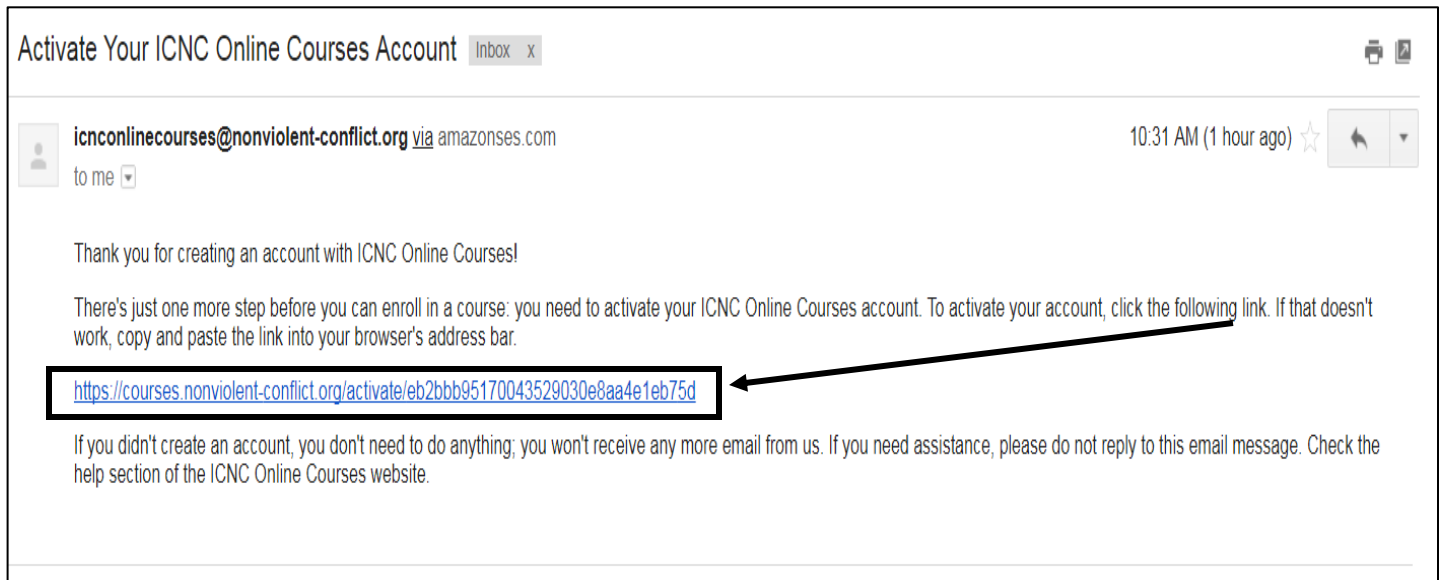

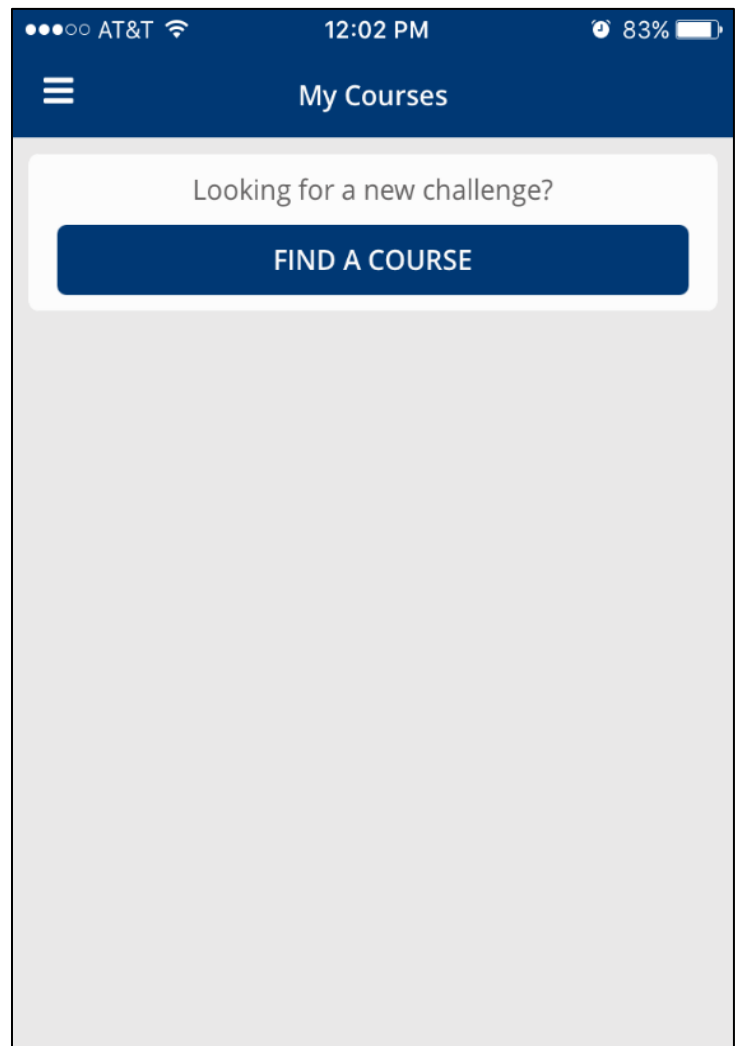
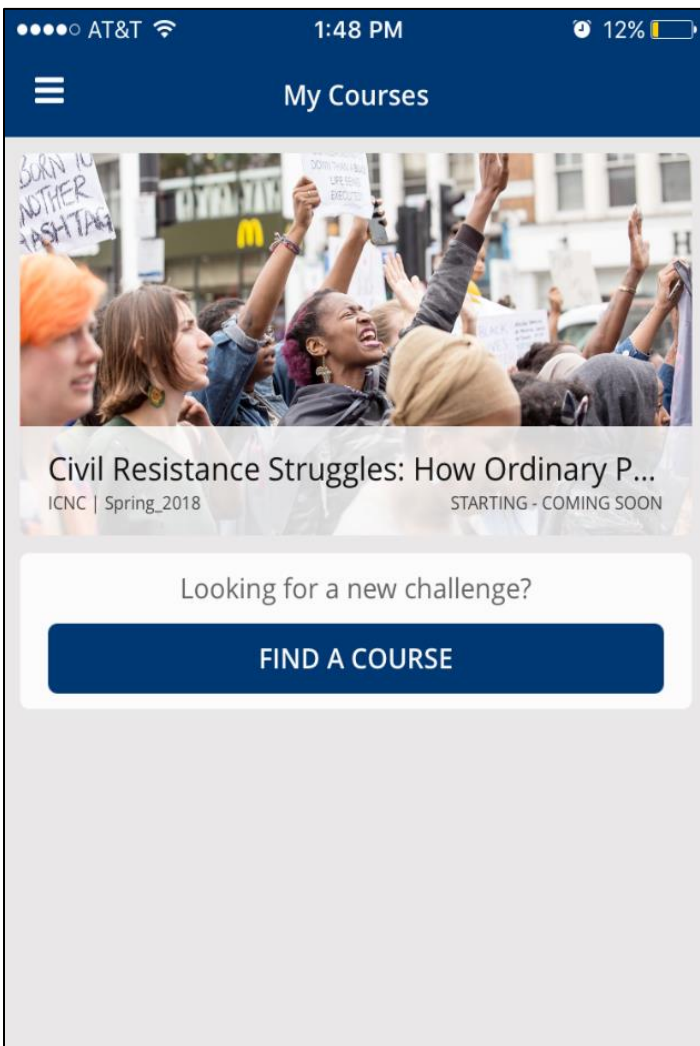

- You will receive an activation email from icnconlinecourses@nonviolent-conflict.org. You **must** go to your email account and **click on the activation link in the email**.



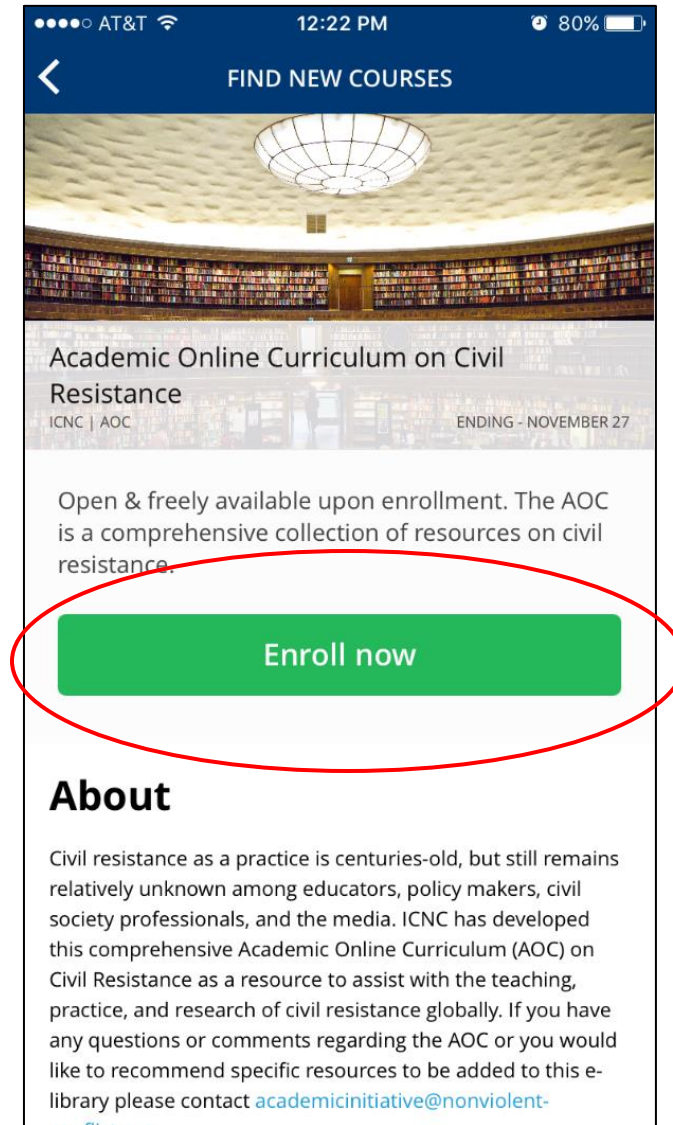
- Return to the mobile app.

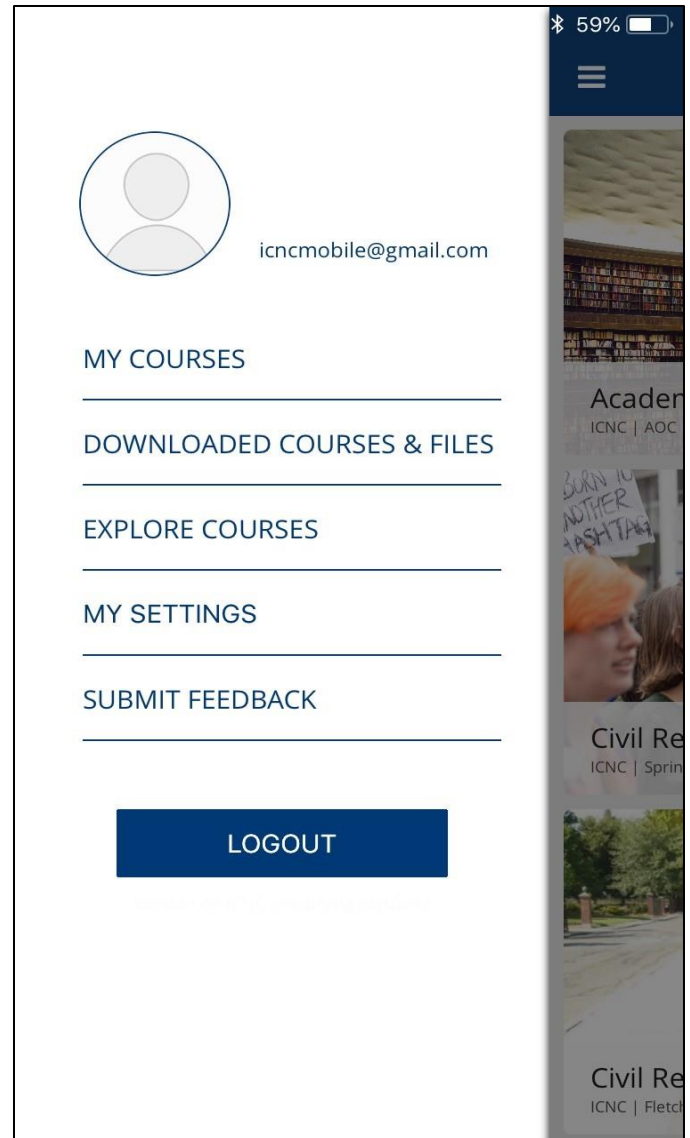
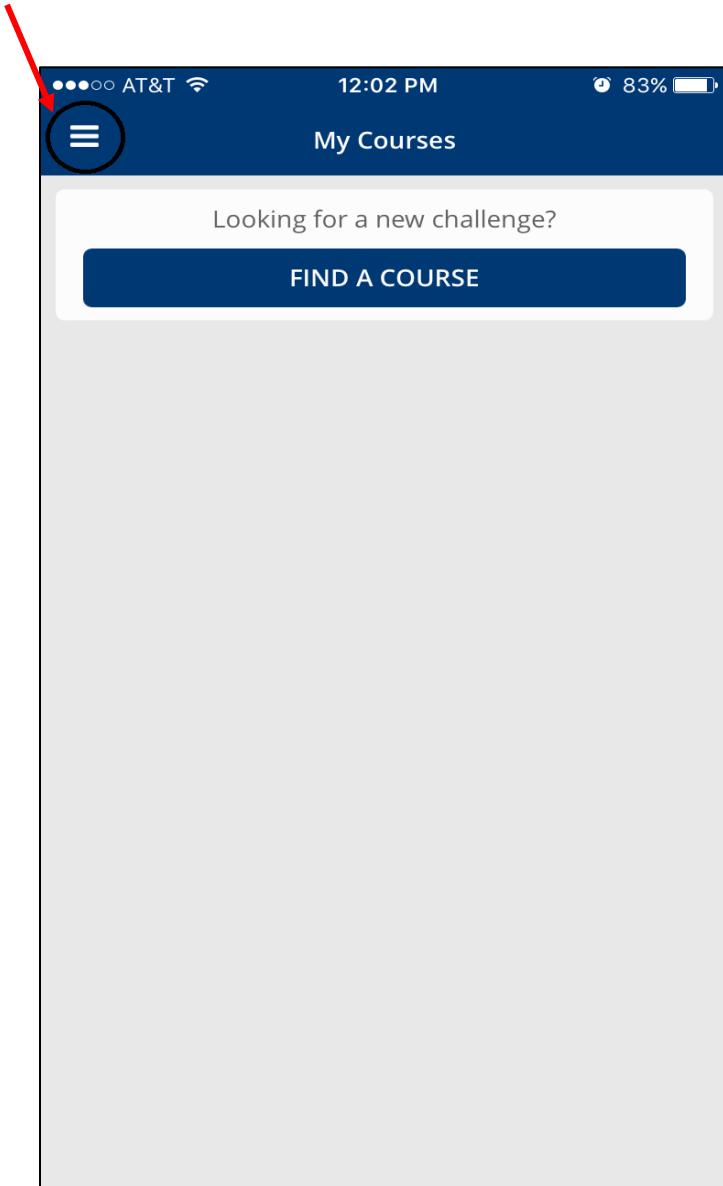

III. Mobile App Course Use & Navigation

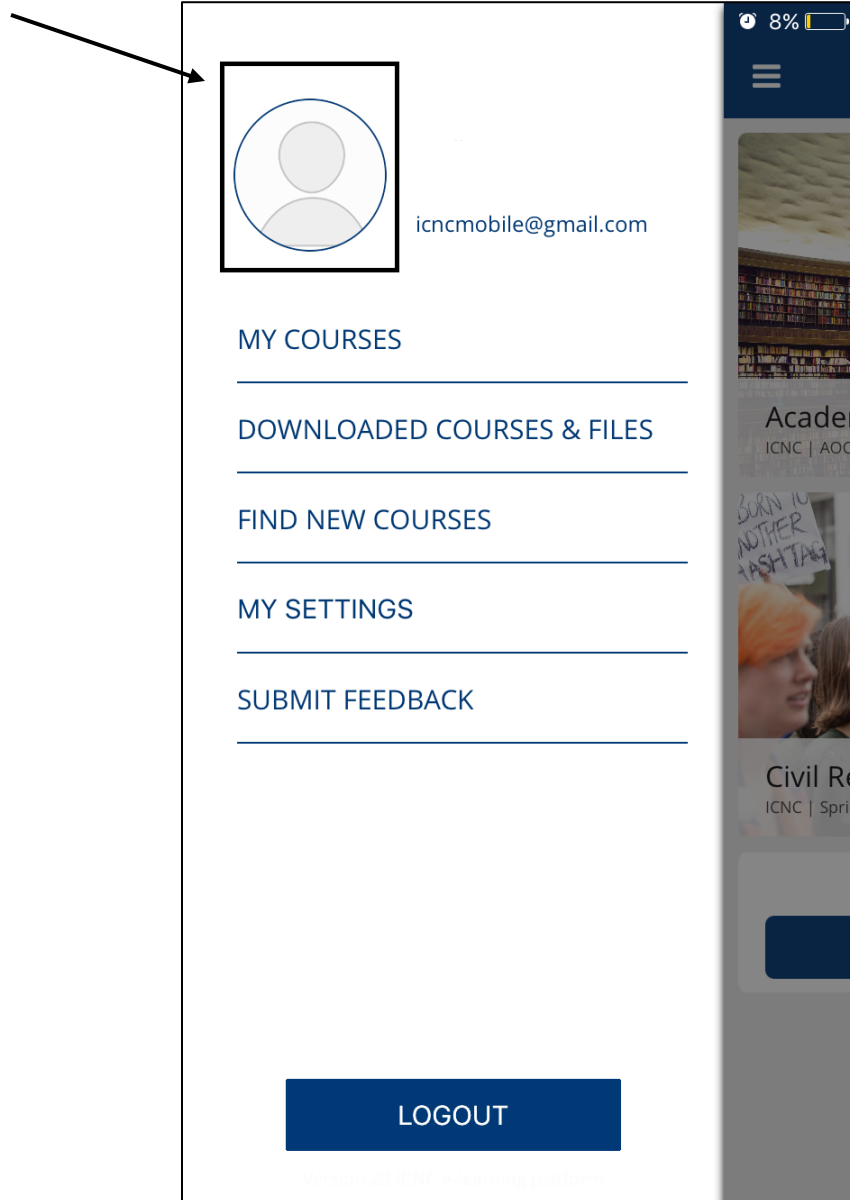
- **Main menu**

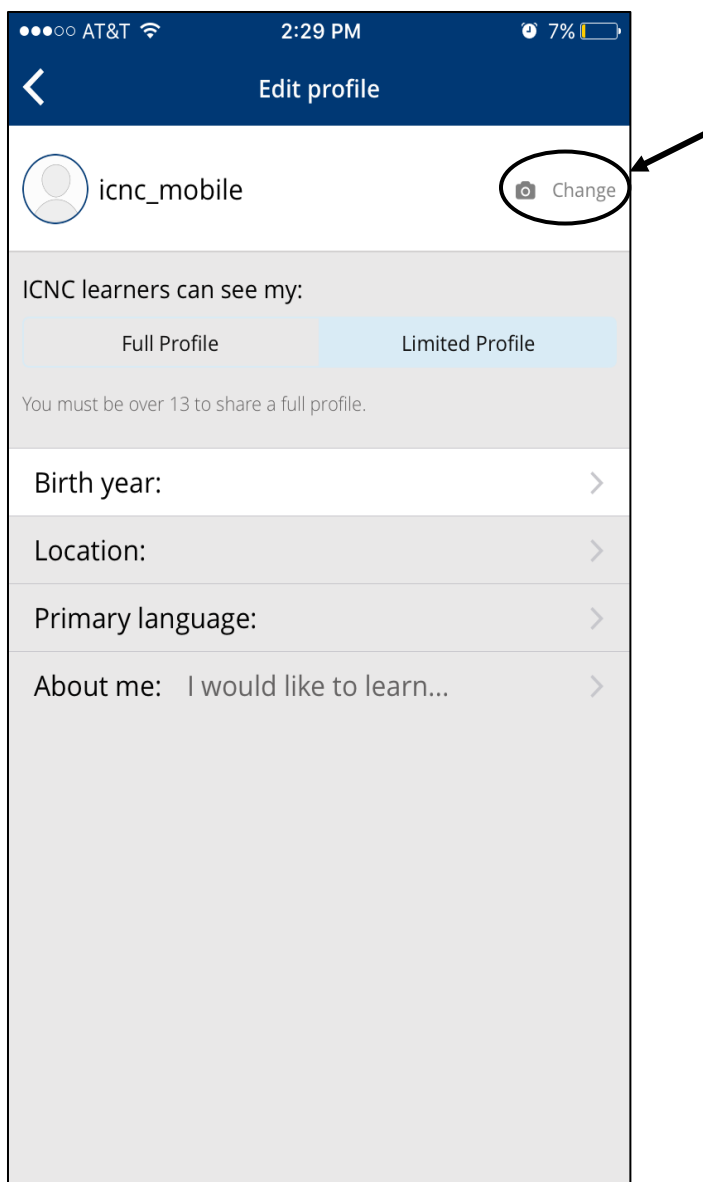


ii. Profile

1. To edit your profile and set up a profile picture, tap on the image icon. This will take you to your profile page.

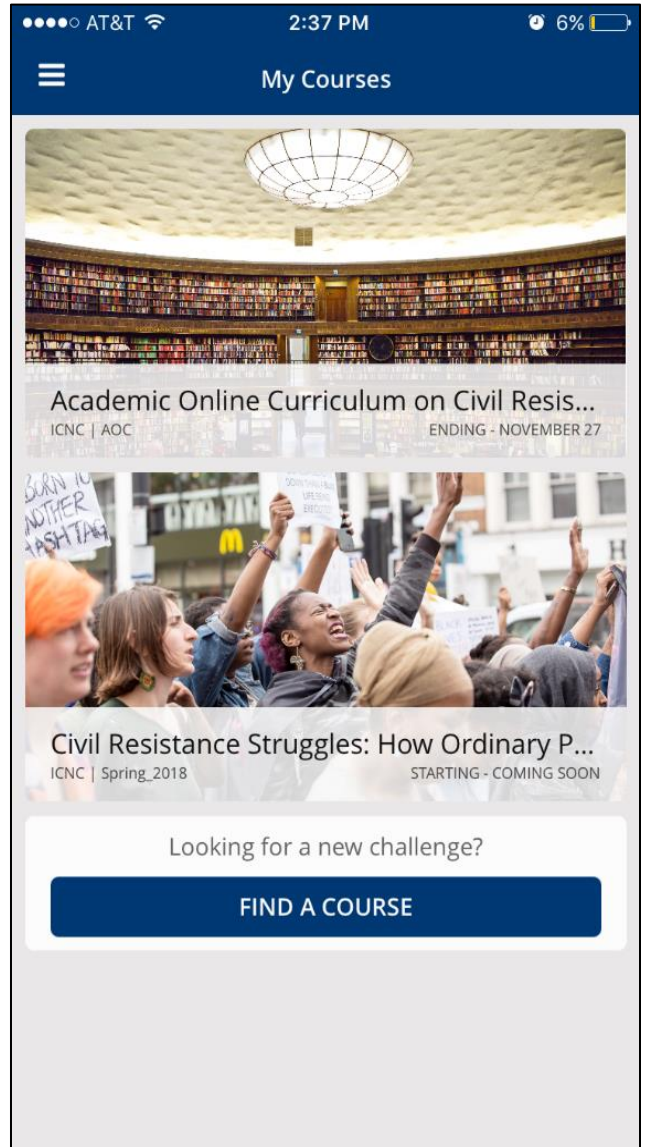
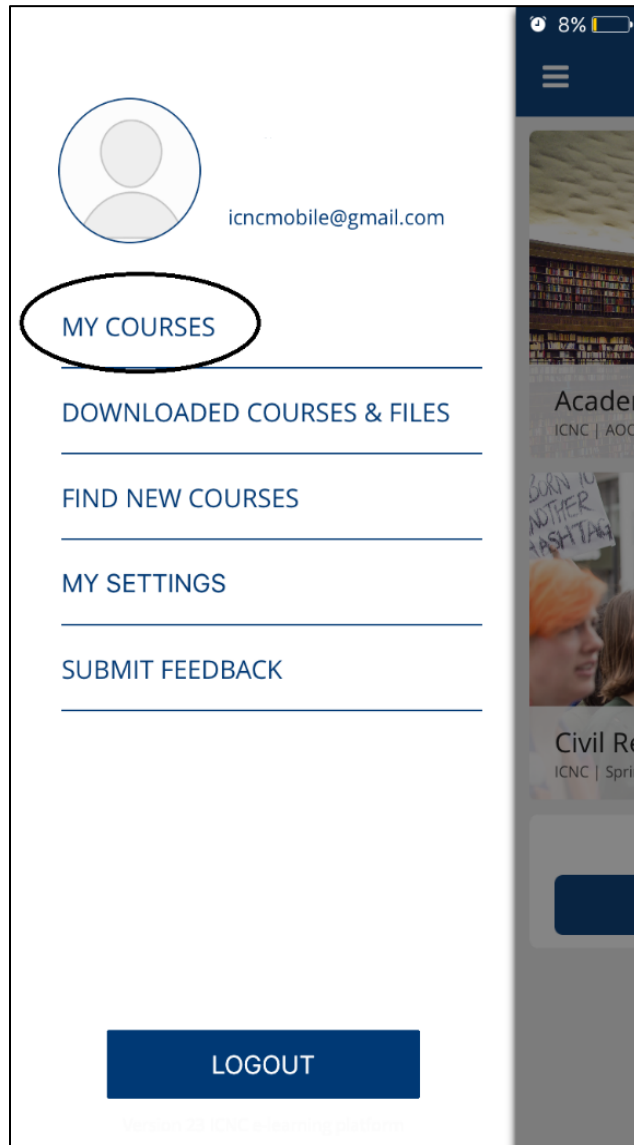

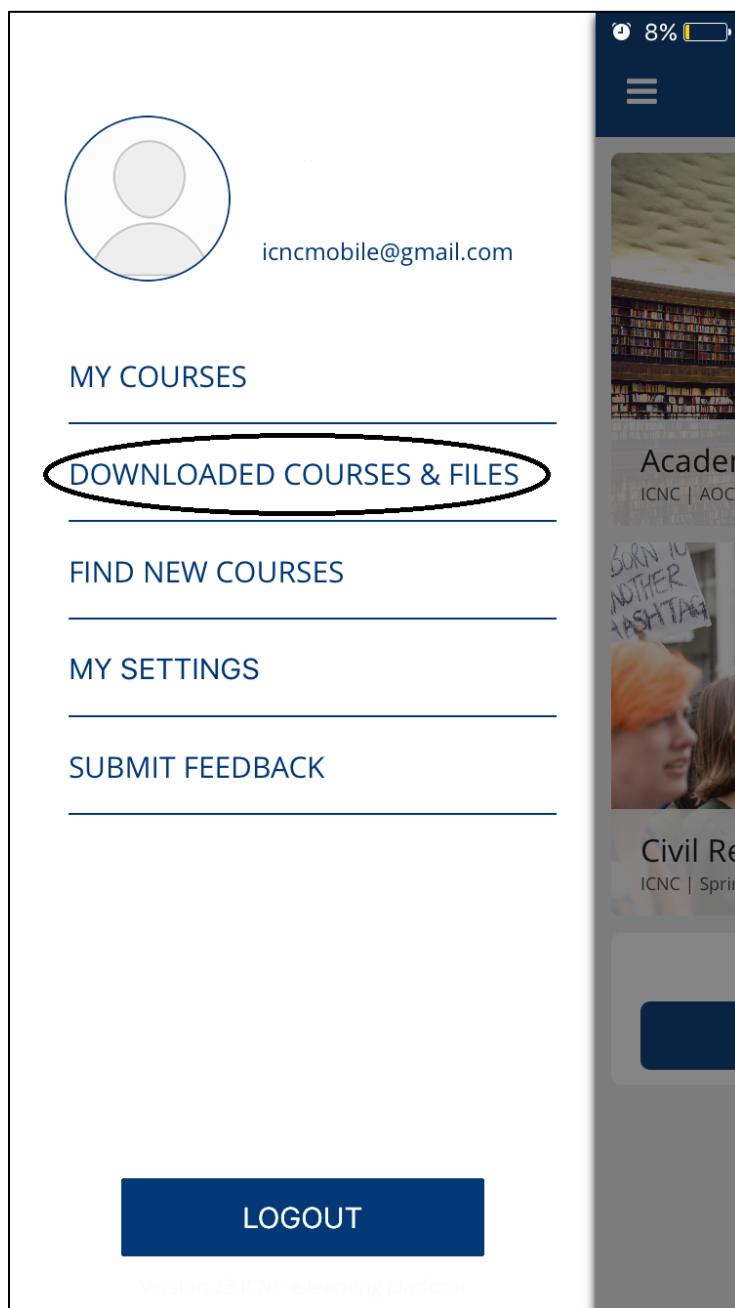
iii. My Courses

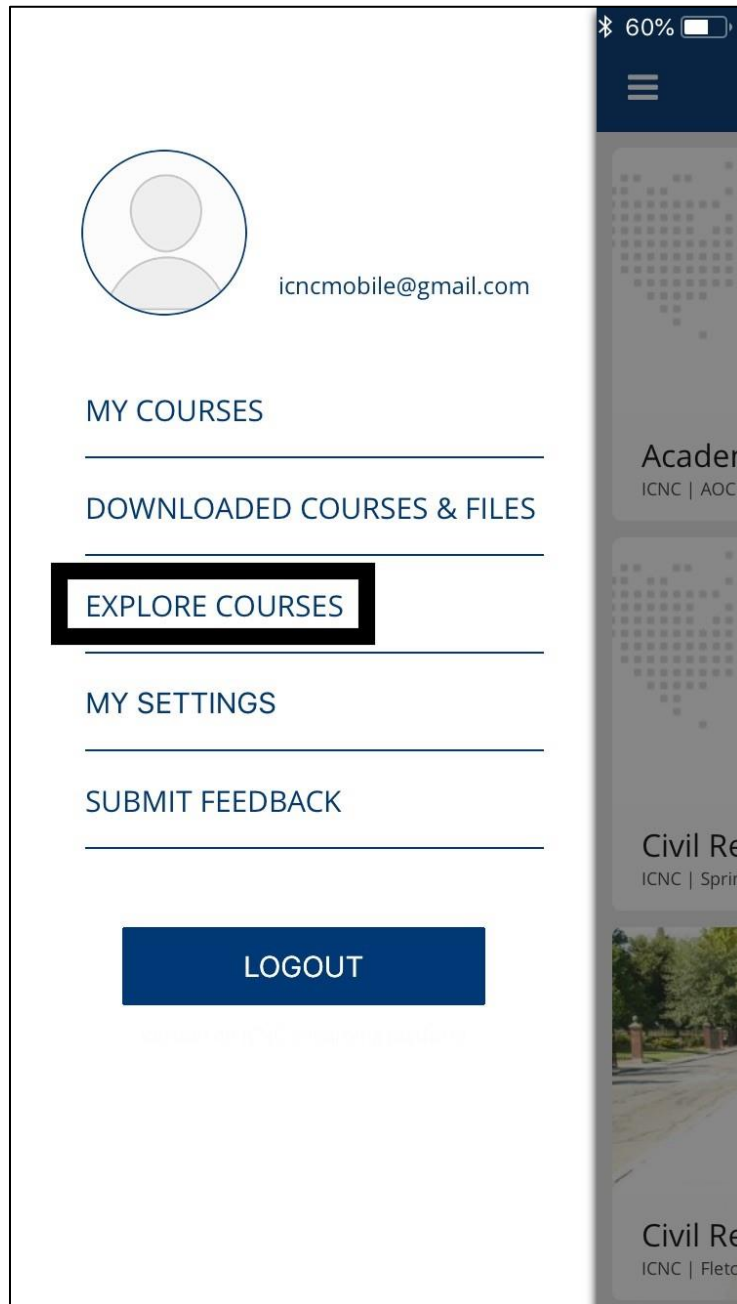
iv. **Downloaded Courses & Files**

This tab will take you to all of your downloaded courses and files. See section six of this guide for more information on Downloaded Courses & Files.



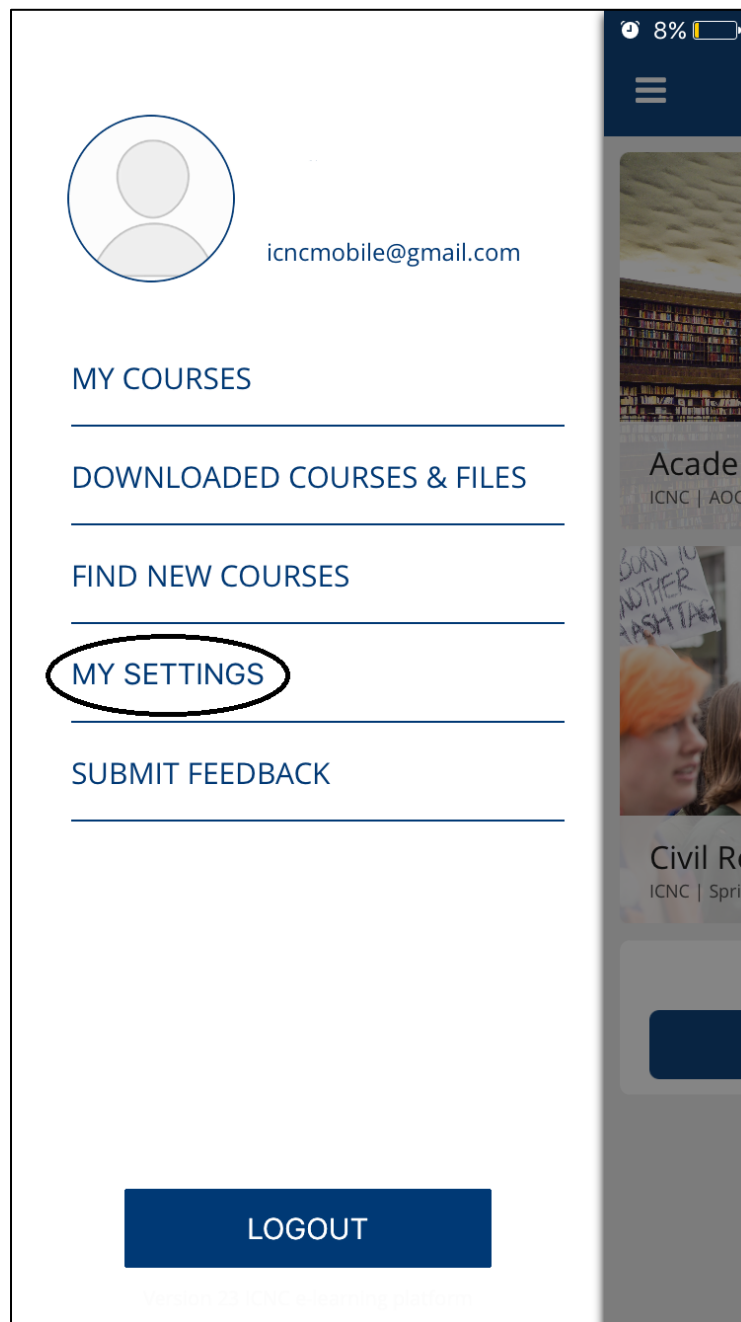
v. **Explore All Courses**

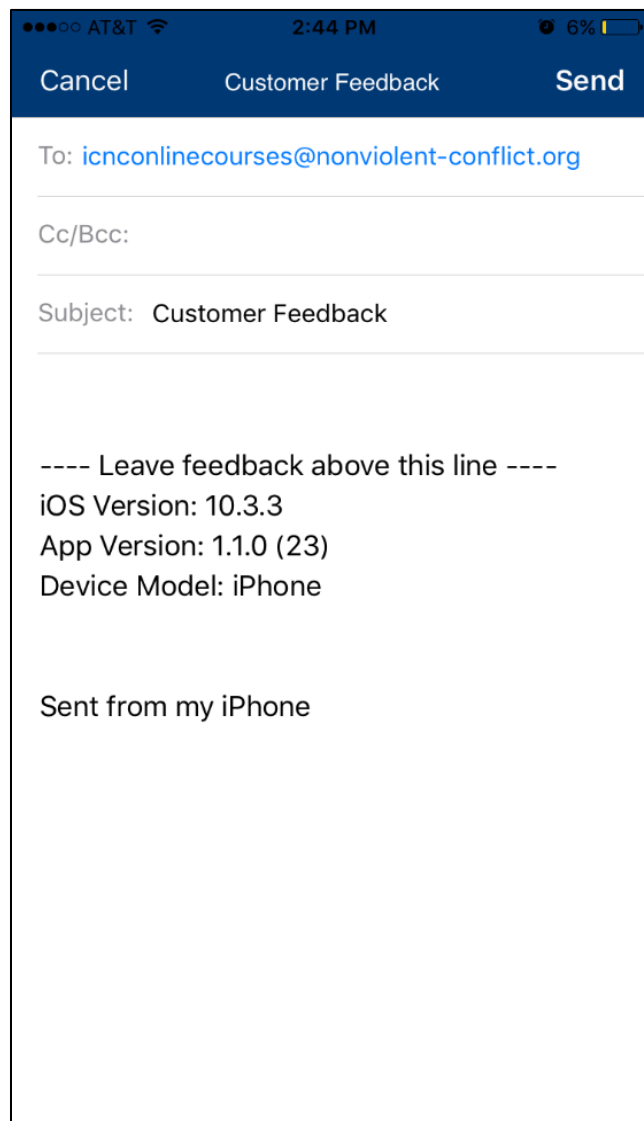
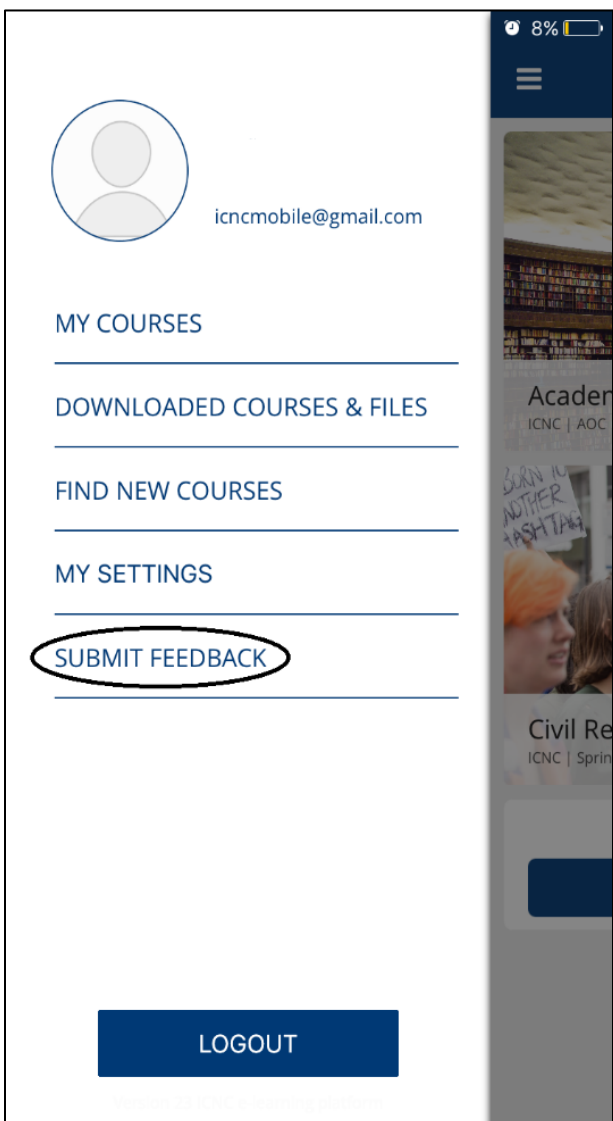

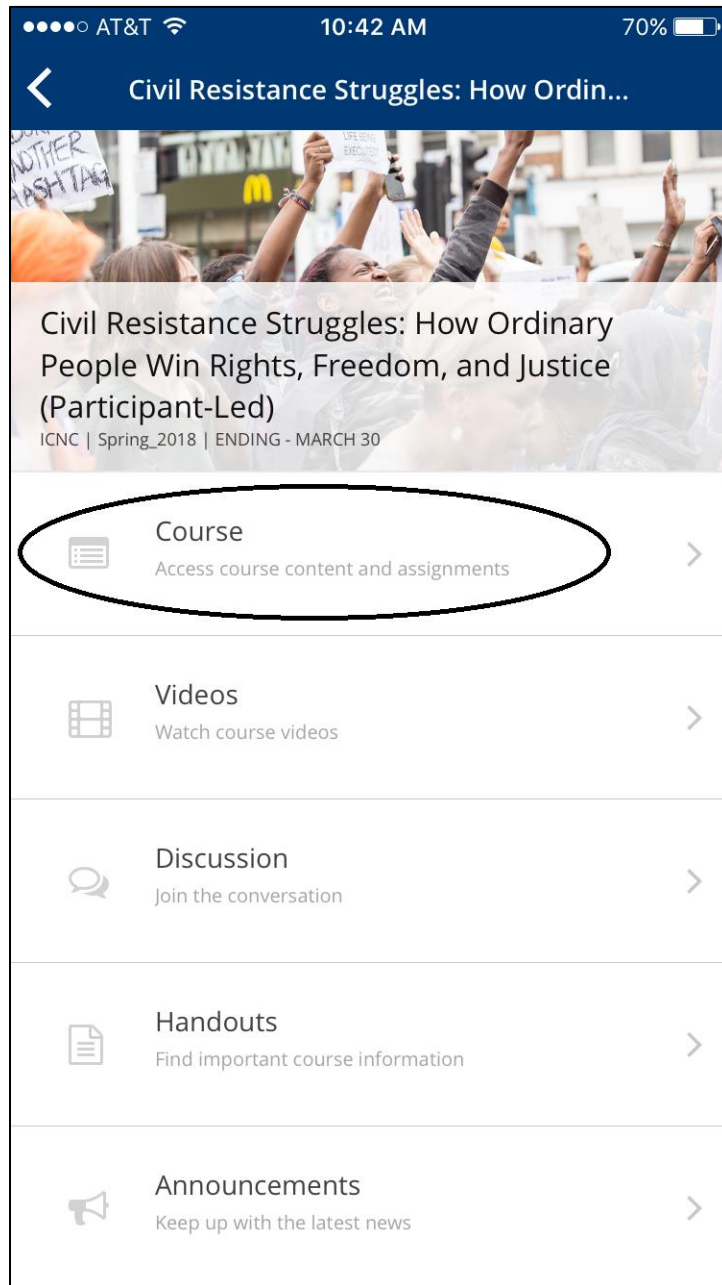
Clicking on **Submit Feedback** will open up an email to icnconlinecourses@nonviolent-conflict.org. You can send feedback on glitches or other technical errors.

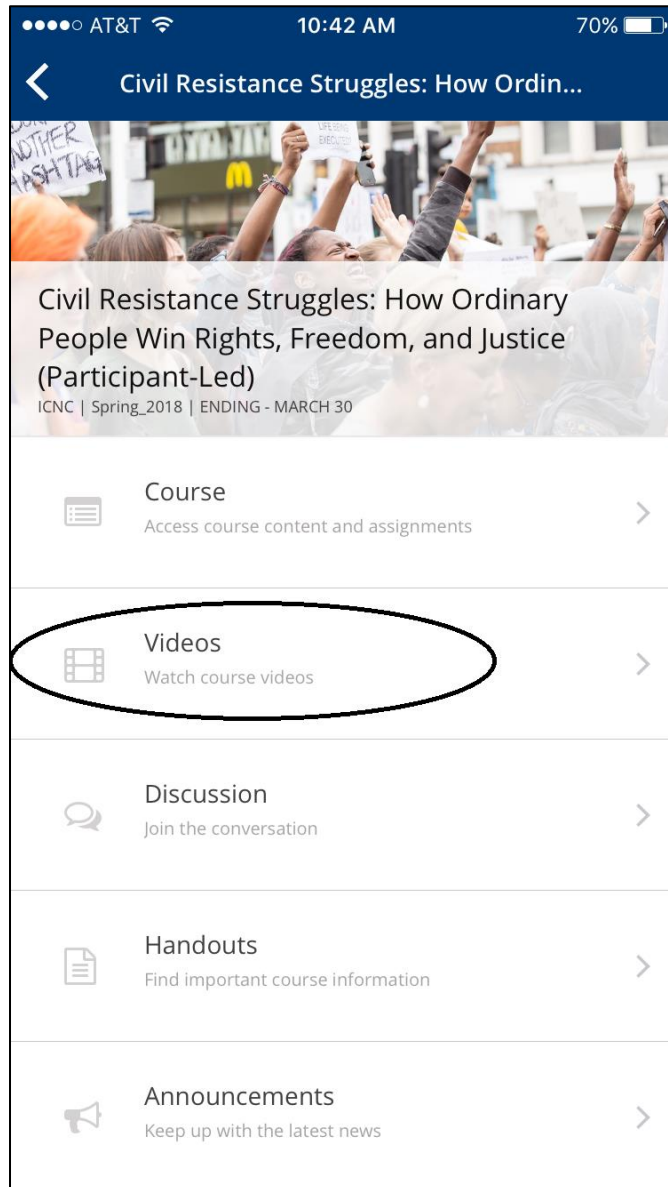
- i. **Course**

1. You can view the **course outline** and access all course content, such as PDFs, videos, discussion forums, etc. by clicking on the **Course** tab.



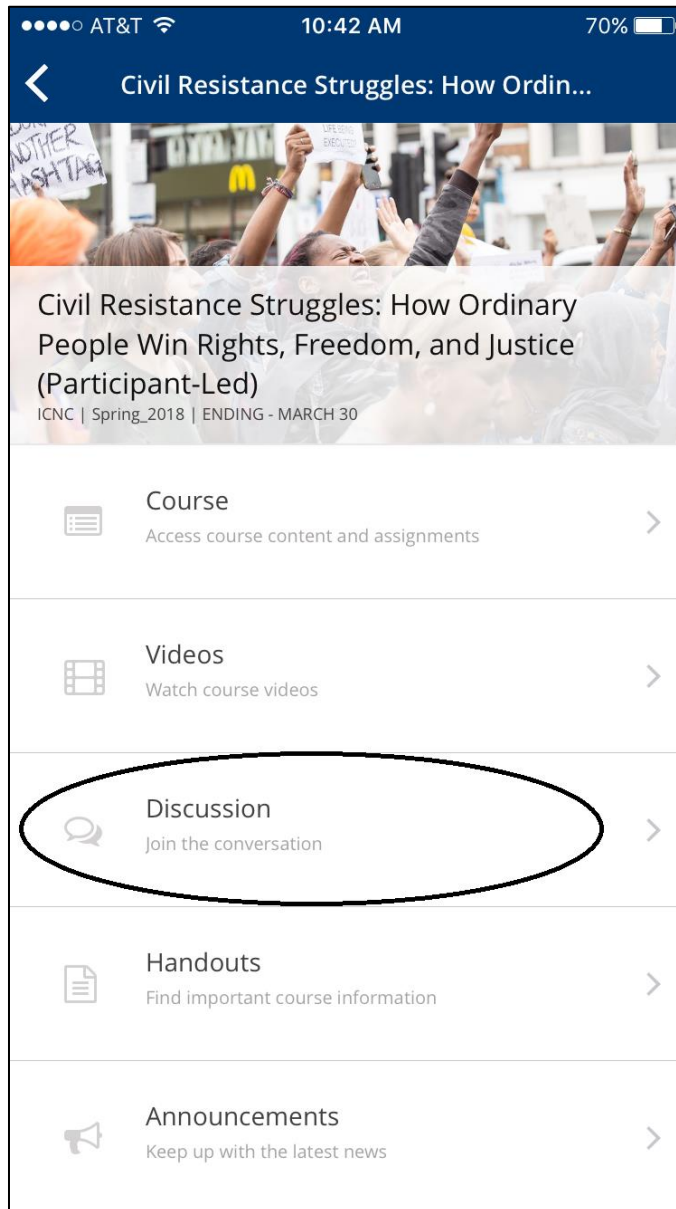
ii. Videos

 - a. Only videos that can be downloaded in the mobile app will appear in the **Video tab**.



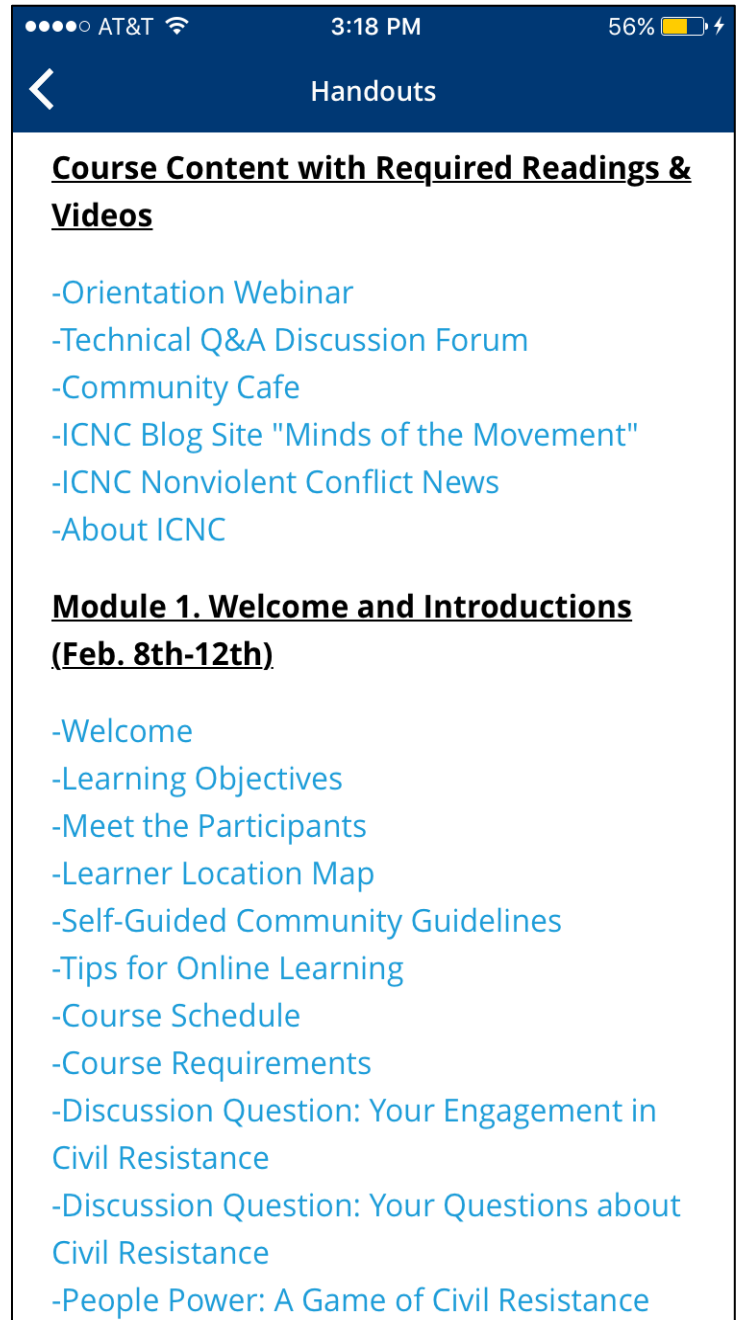
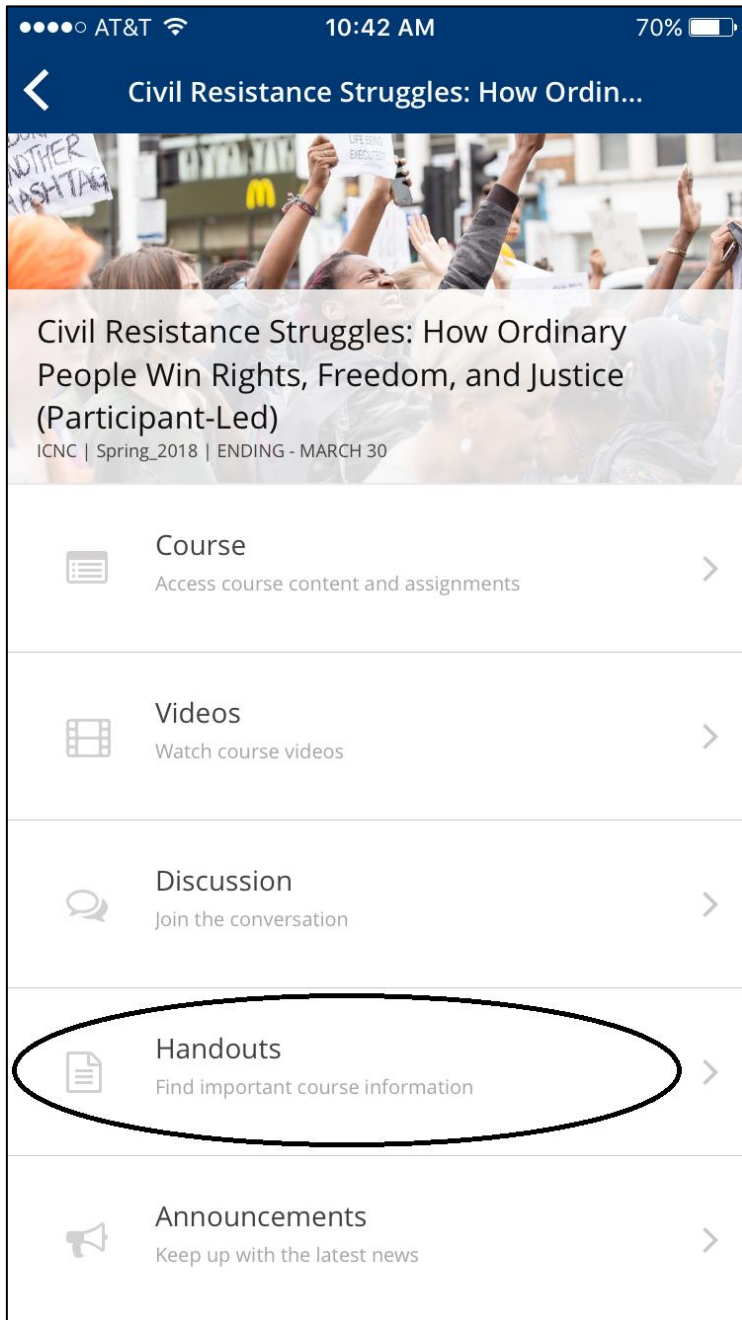
iii. **Discussion**

1. You can access all of the course discussions through the **Discussion** tab. Please note that discussions can only be accessed when connected to the Internet.



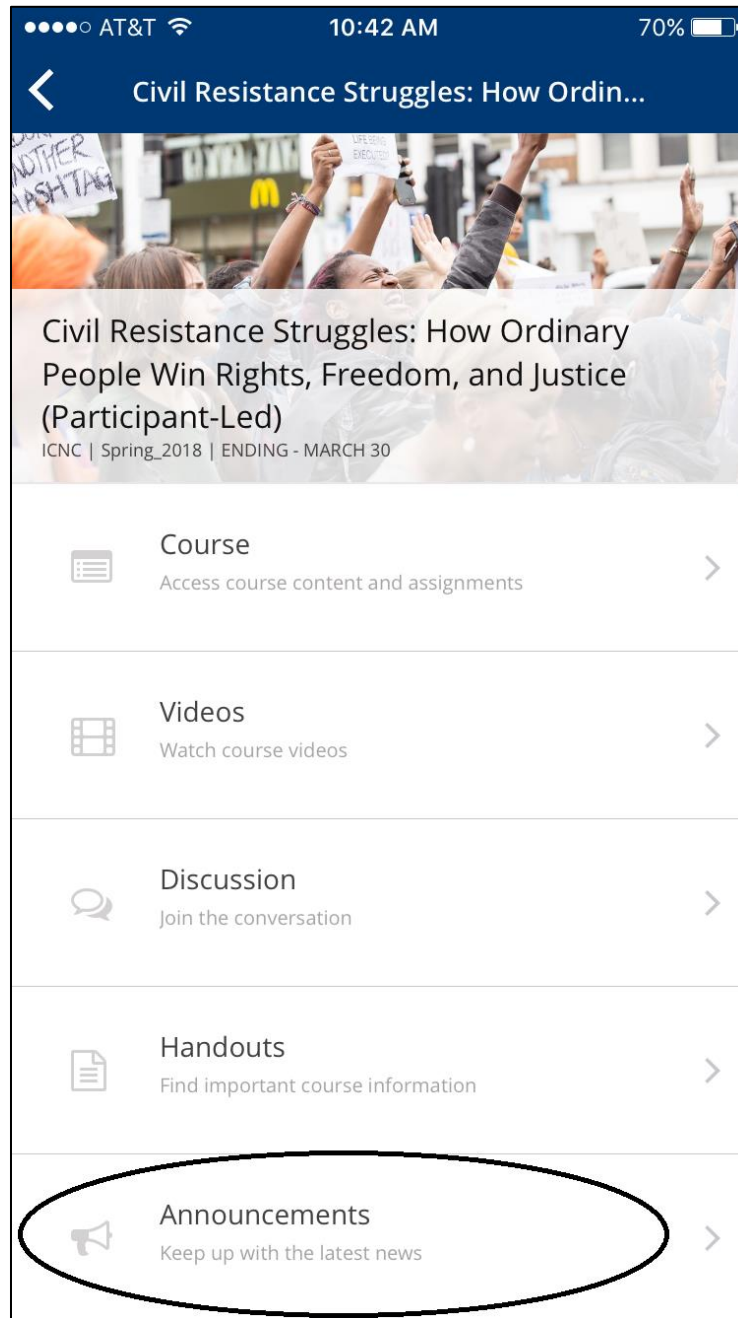
iv. **Handouts**

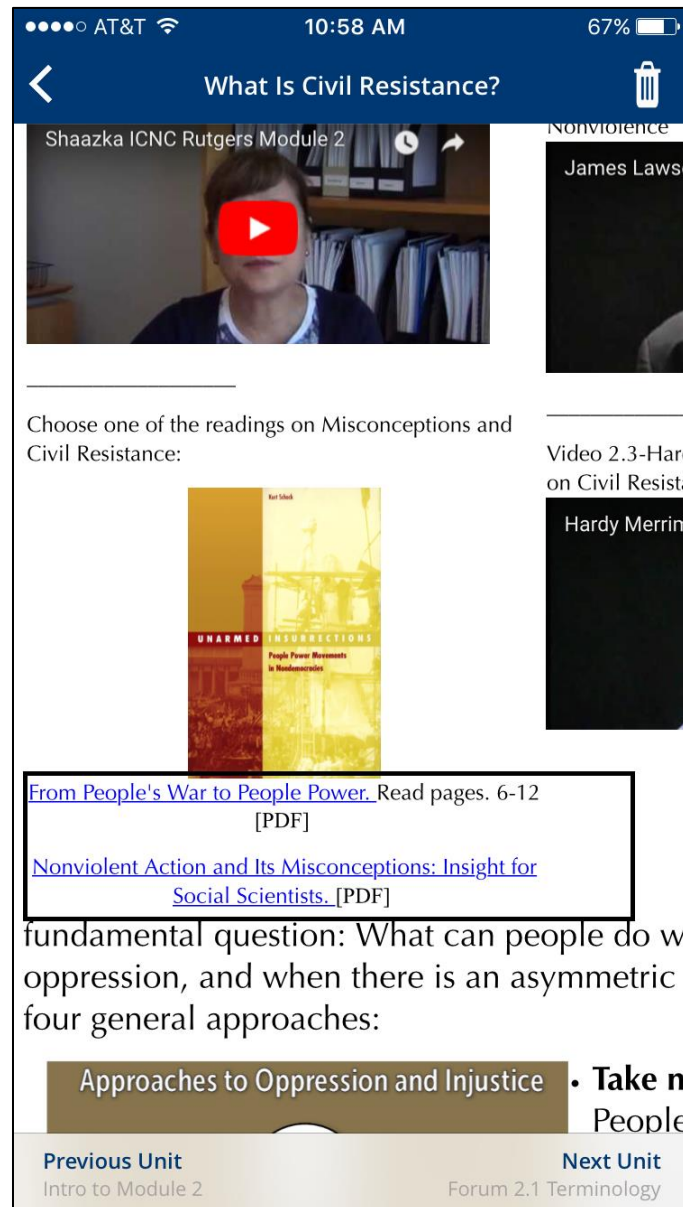


3. After clicking on the unit name, you will need to click on **Download** and be connected to the Internet to see its content.



ii. **Accessing PDFs**

2. The PDF will open up **within the mobile app**. Please note that if you want the PDF downloaded on your phone **outside of the mobile app**, please use the **share** button at the bottom of the PDF to save it to iBooks or another iOS PDF reader.





iii. Videos

1. ICNC's online courses uses two types of videos: **YouTube videos & Downloadable videos.**
2. YouTube videos will usually be found **within course units.** YouTube videos cannot be watched offline or downloaded. Users can watch YouTube videos within the mobile app.

It is important to study power to understand why and how civil resistance works. The traditional understanding of power looks at power in a top-down manner. This view recognizes only those in formal power positions (e.g. "powerholders" such as presidents, prime ministers, presidents of the central banks, etc) or focuses merely on power structures (parliament, presidency, security services, military, etc.) This type of political power is known as monolithic power.



Attributes of monolithic power:

- All power resides at the top
- Structure is unchanging unless powerholders decide to do so
- Ordinary people are not powerholders

1- The 10 most important points useful coverage of civil resistance campaigns in external media (State, Corporate or public interests outlets):

1.1 First, media landscape, in civil resistance campaigns,

In this point, the activists must be able to identify the type of useful media for coverage. It means we have to know what is the dominate media in the region/ country. So, it is not careful to mention a single media (here), because media choice depend on one country to another or from a movement to another

For example, in Nepal, the media commonly used are Local, National and International television, print media (Newspaper, Magazines, etc) and online news portals, Radio or FM Stations and then social media like facebook, twitter, Viber, Whatsapp and so on.

As a part of the media campaign in civil resistance, people mobilize mostly the private media; especially television, radio and print media- which can cover protests and campaigns of nonviolent movement. And those media make pressure on state government and authorities. In contrast, it is really difficult to mobilize State media.

However, in Mali, the useful media to cover your civil resistance movement are local and National radio stations. And then social media come strengthen and facilitate people participation in civil resistance movement. The people are attracted by the two types of media.

1.2 Second, Media contribution to a successful nonviolent movement,

In nonviolent movement protest, you should plan to cooperate well with media during your activities.

For example,

In beginning of civil resistance, you can declare the press statement and invite the private media for press conference, which helps campaigners to reach with larger audience immediate after declaration of civil resistance and protest.

Thus, during the movement, protesters can invite media for coverage of the activities and show the people participation

At the end of your march/ protest, plan a personal meeting with media house and providing updates to journalists in regular basis also helps to reach out with larger audience.

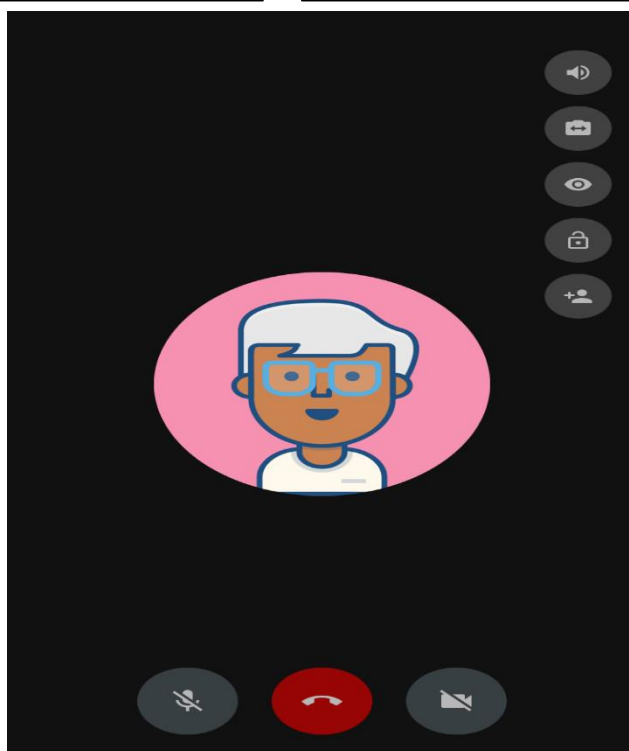
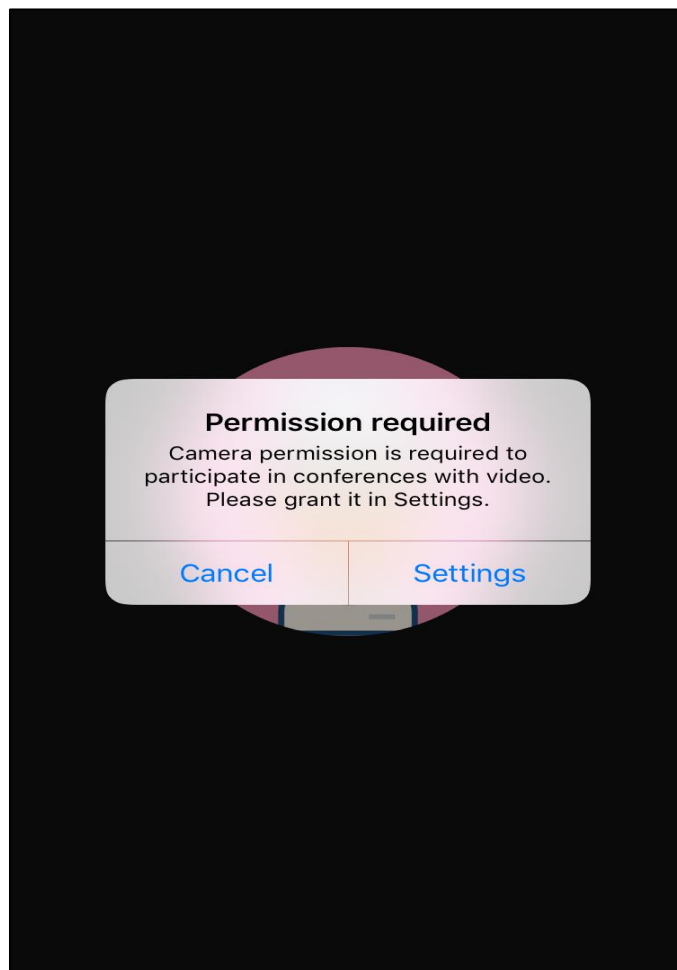
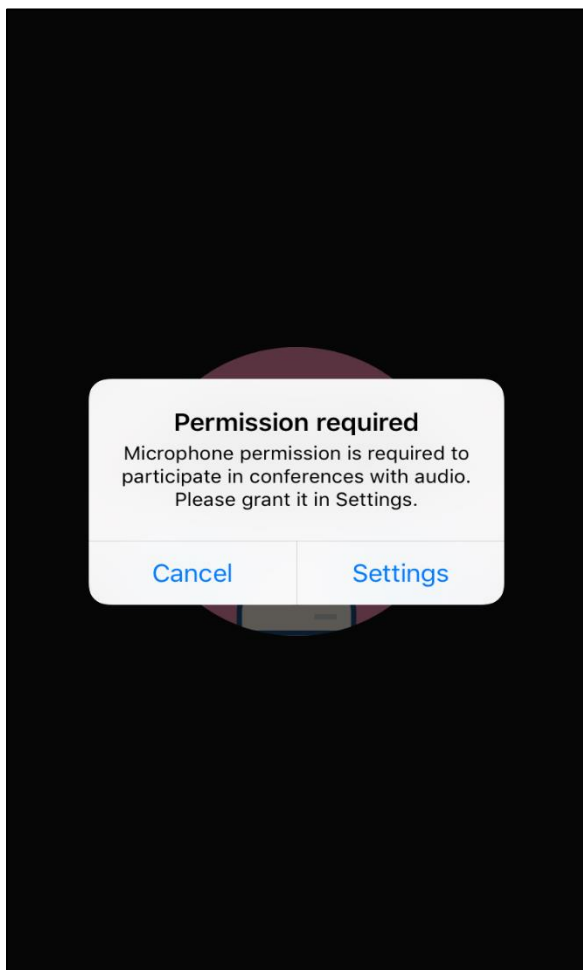
1. ICNC provides two tools for video conferencing: **Big Blue Button** & **Jitsi Meet**. **Big Blue Button** does not work within the mobile app.
2. To use **Jitsi Meet**, you will need to download the app through your **App Store**.



3. After the download is complete, return to the mobile app, navigate to the video conference unit and click on the **Jitsi Meet** link. The video conference will launch through the Jitsi Meet app.

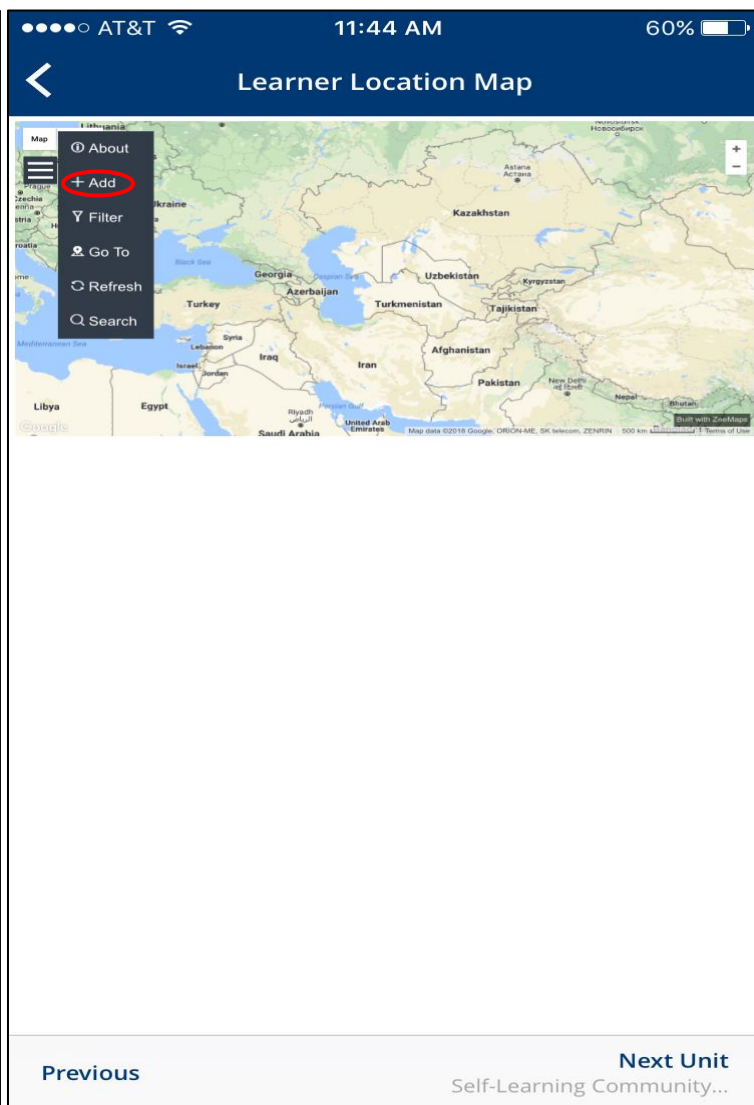
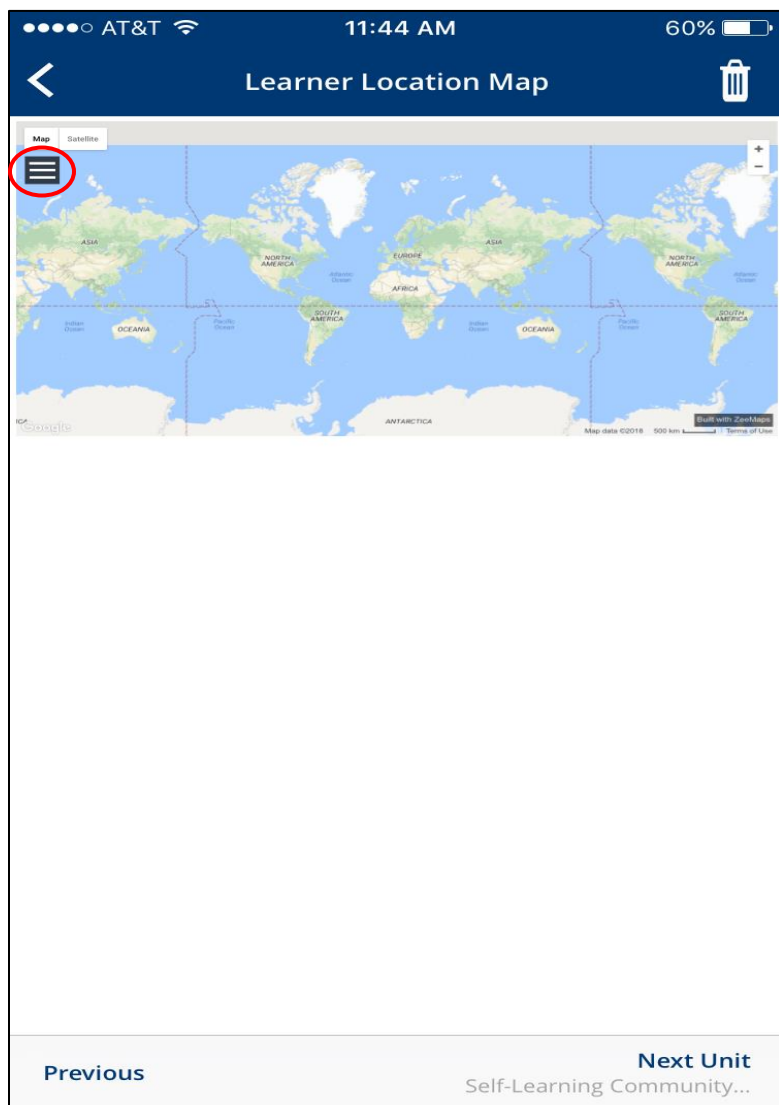


4. You will need to change your settings to give Jitsi Meet camera and microphone permission. After doing so, the video conference will launch.

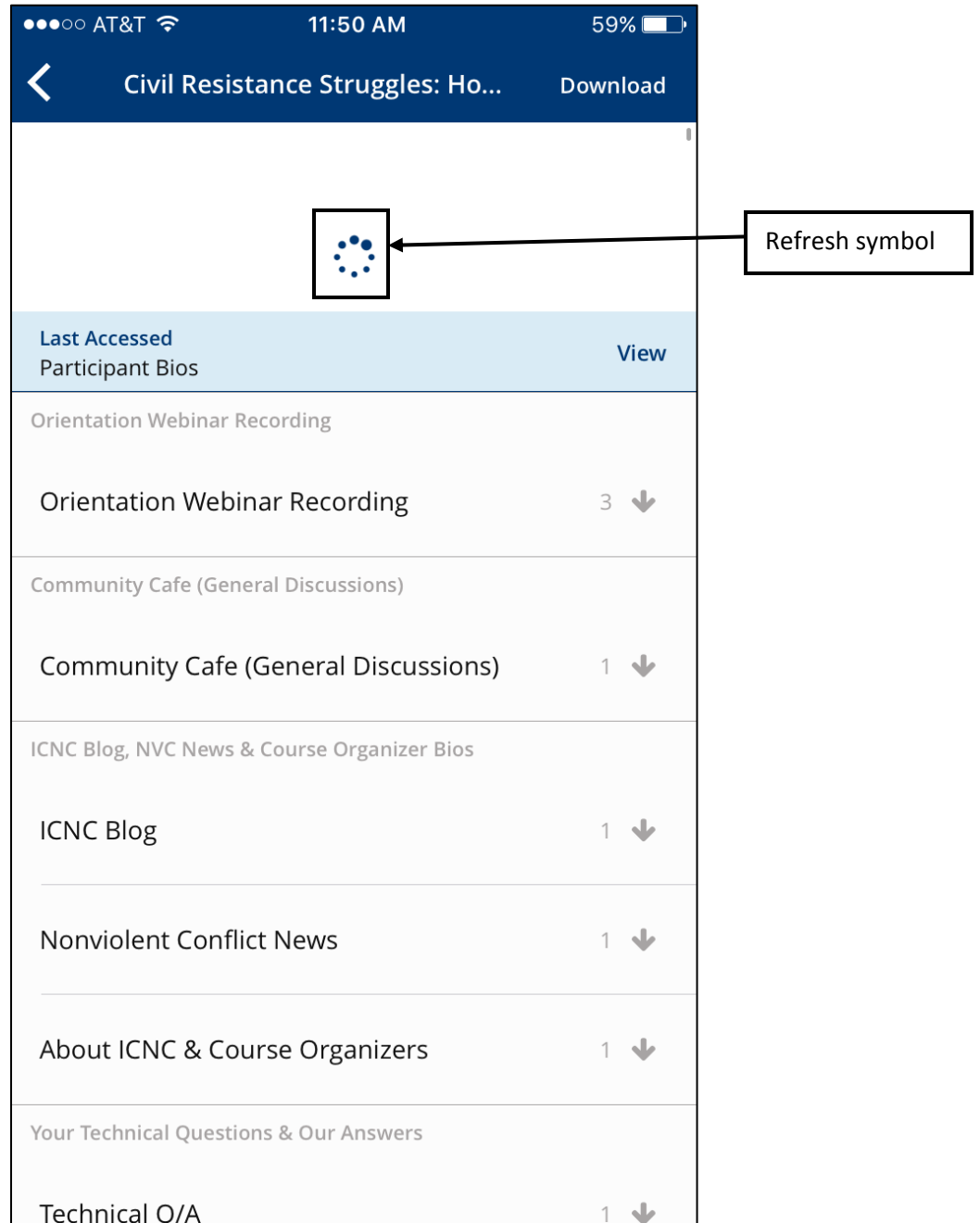

ix. **Refreshing content**

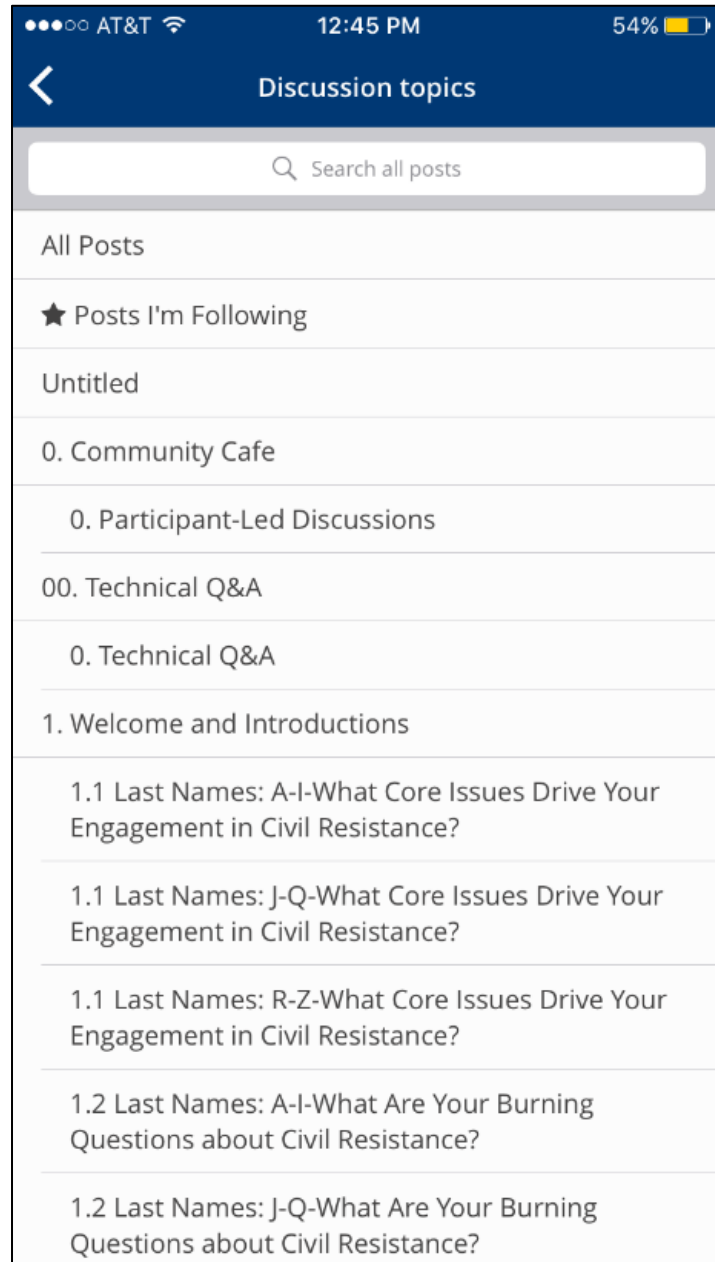
1. Users can manually refresh the mobile app page to update new content. To do so, go to the course outline, drag the page down, and let go when you see the refresh symbol.



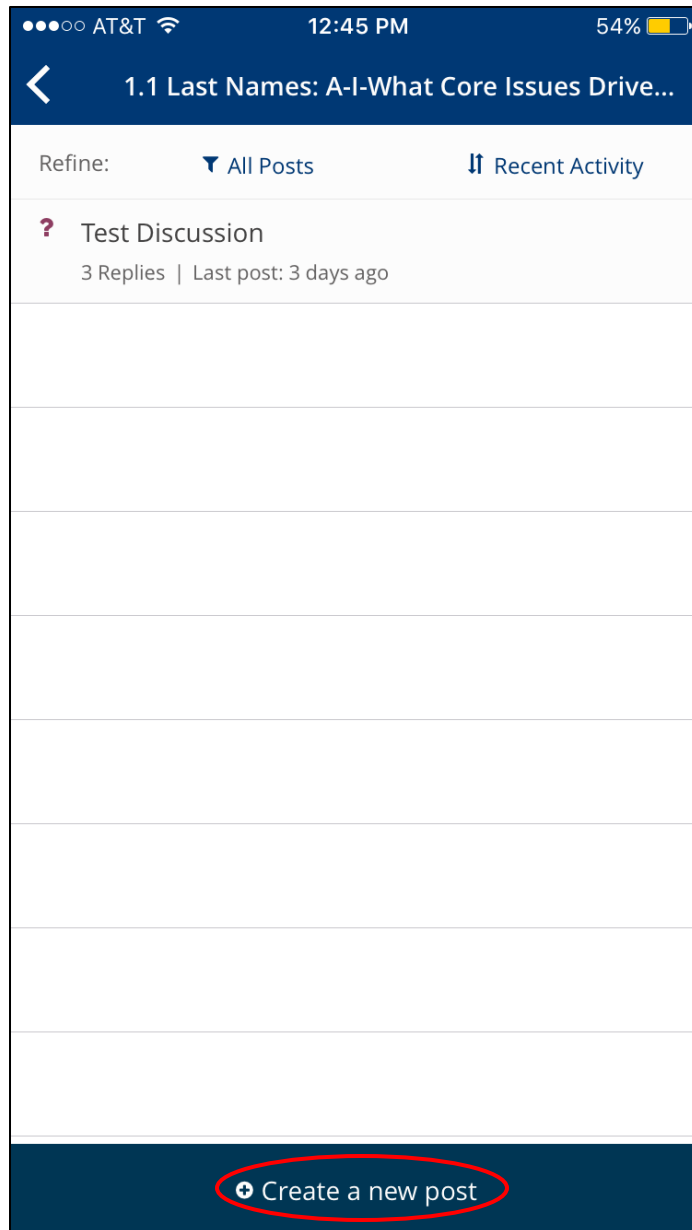
- **Discussions**

- i. **How to post in discussion forums**

2. To create a **new post**, tap on the discussion forum that you want to post in. You will be able to see any posts that have been made in the discussion forum. Tap on **“Create a new post”**



3. When creating a post, please follow these steps:
 - a. Label your post as a “**Question**” or a “**Discussion**”.
 - b. The “**Topic**” field will automatically display the name of the forum that you’re posting in. Make sure that this is the correct discussion forum that you want to post in.
 - c. Give your discussion forum a short title
 - d. Click on “**Post Question**” (or “**Post Discussion**”).

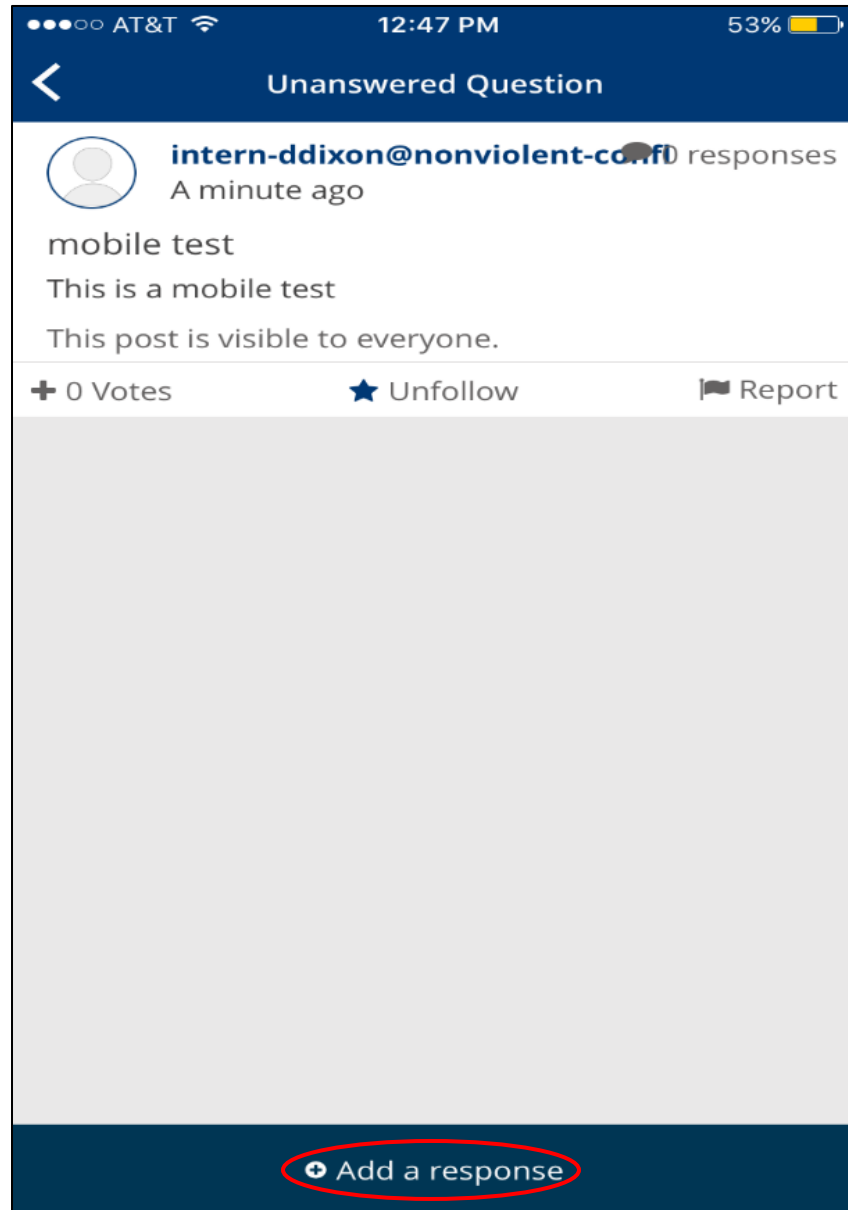

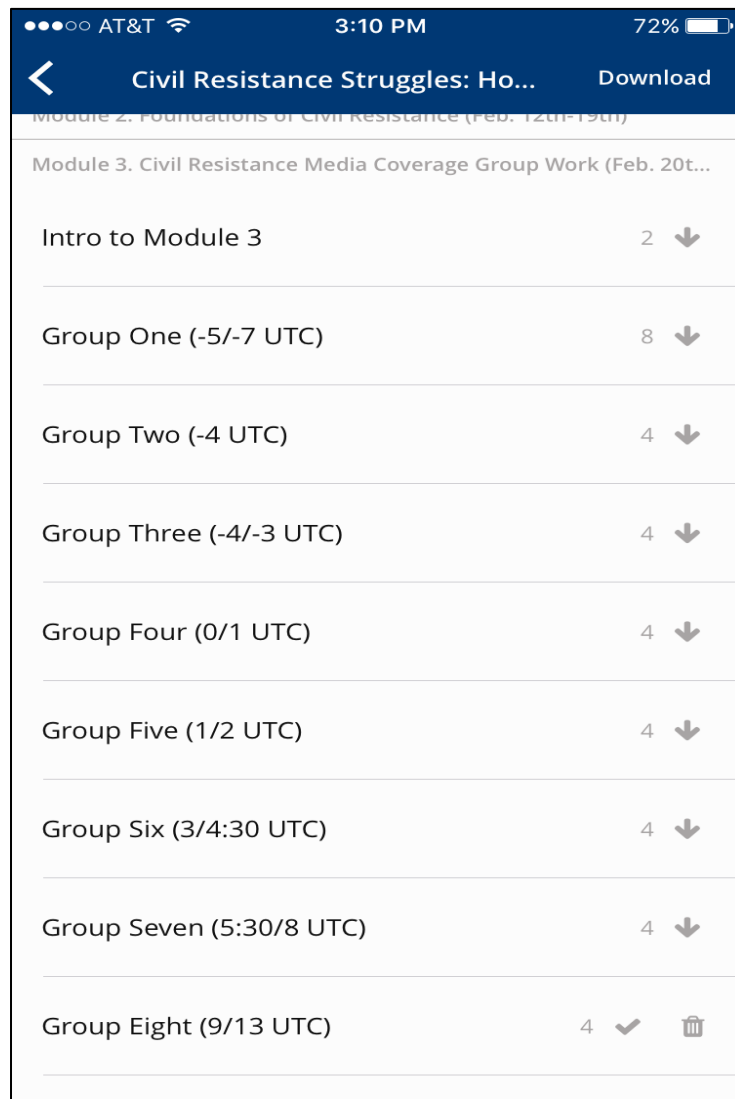

- ii. Before starting group work, always double-check which group you are in. Your group's name will be in the section title. Tap on the section title to see the group content.



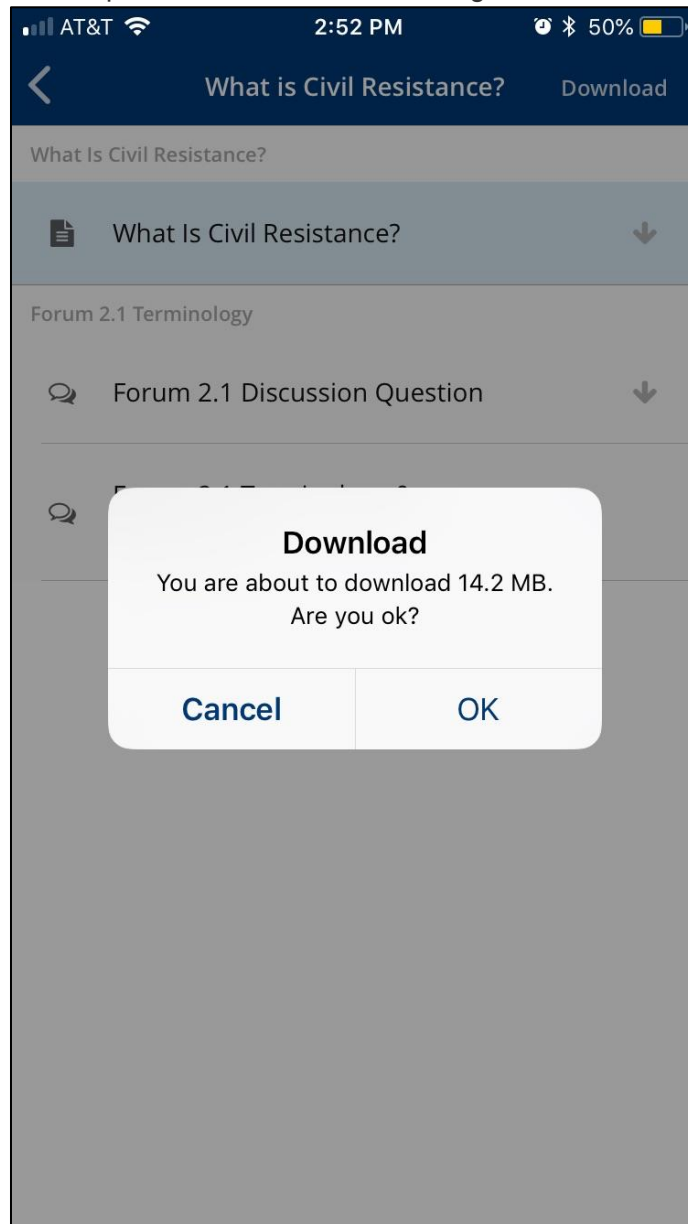
VI. Downloading Course Content

 - To download a course, tap on **Download** at the top of the course page. A circle will appear to indicate the download's progress.

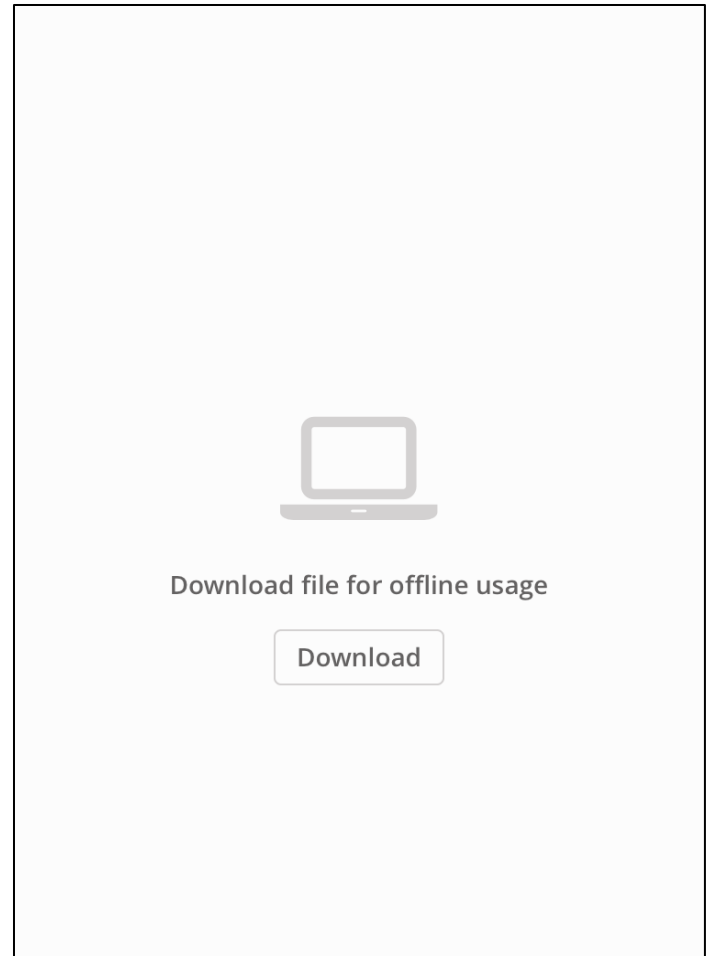
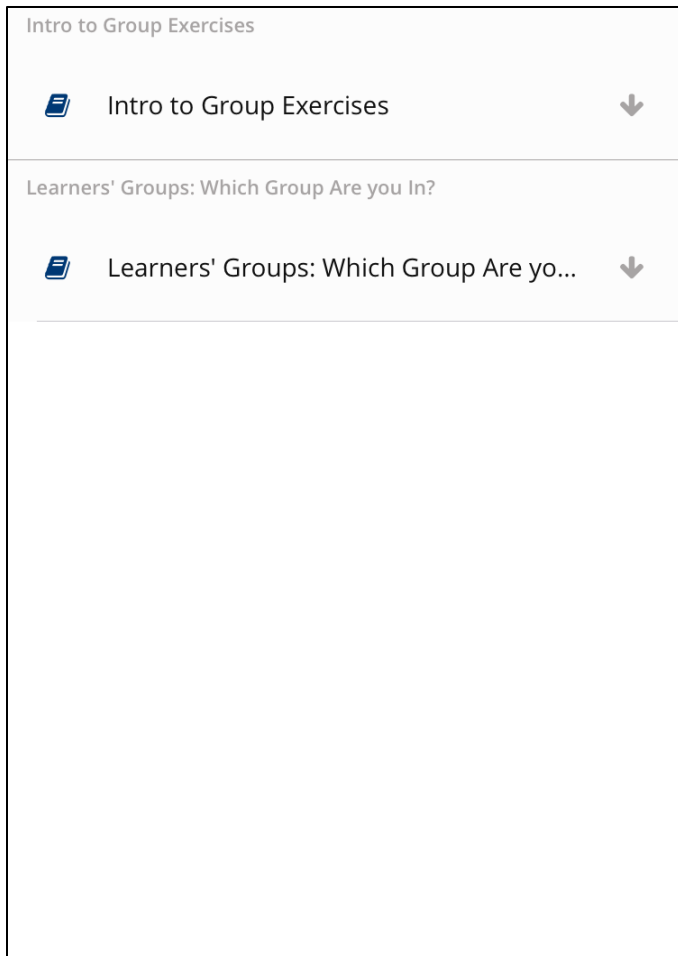

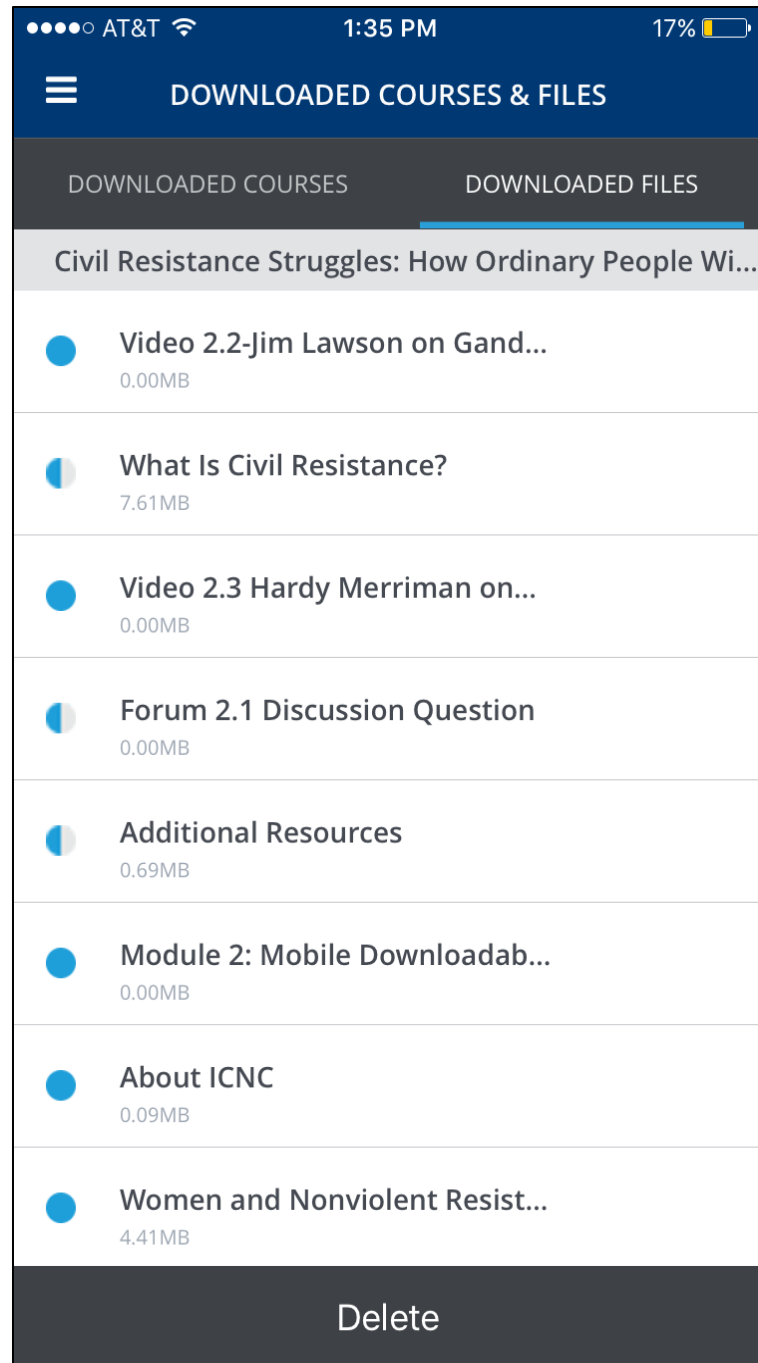
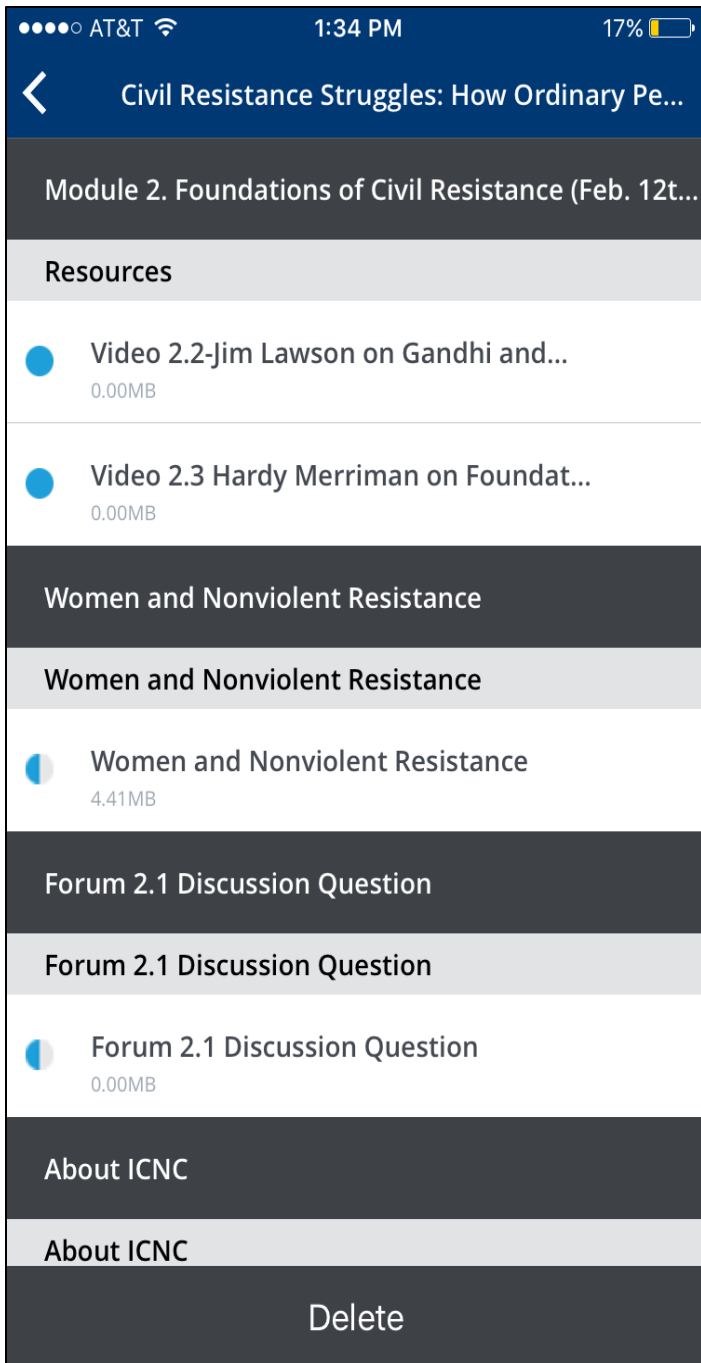
- iv. To download units, tap on the download arrow next to the unit name. Users will not be able to access the unit without downloading it.



- **Using Downloaded Courses & Files**
 - Downloaded content can be accessed in two locations: 1. Downloaded Courses & 2. Downloaded Files.
 - In Downloaded Courses, users can view the courses where they have downloaded content. When users click on a course, they will see all of the downloaded content for that course.

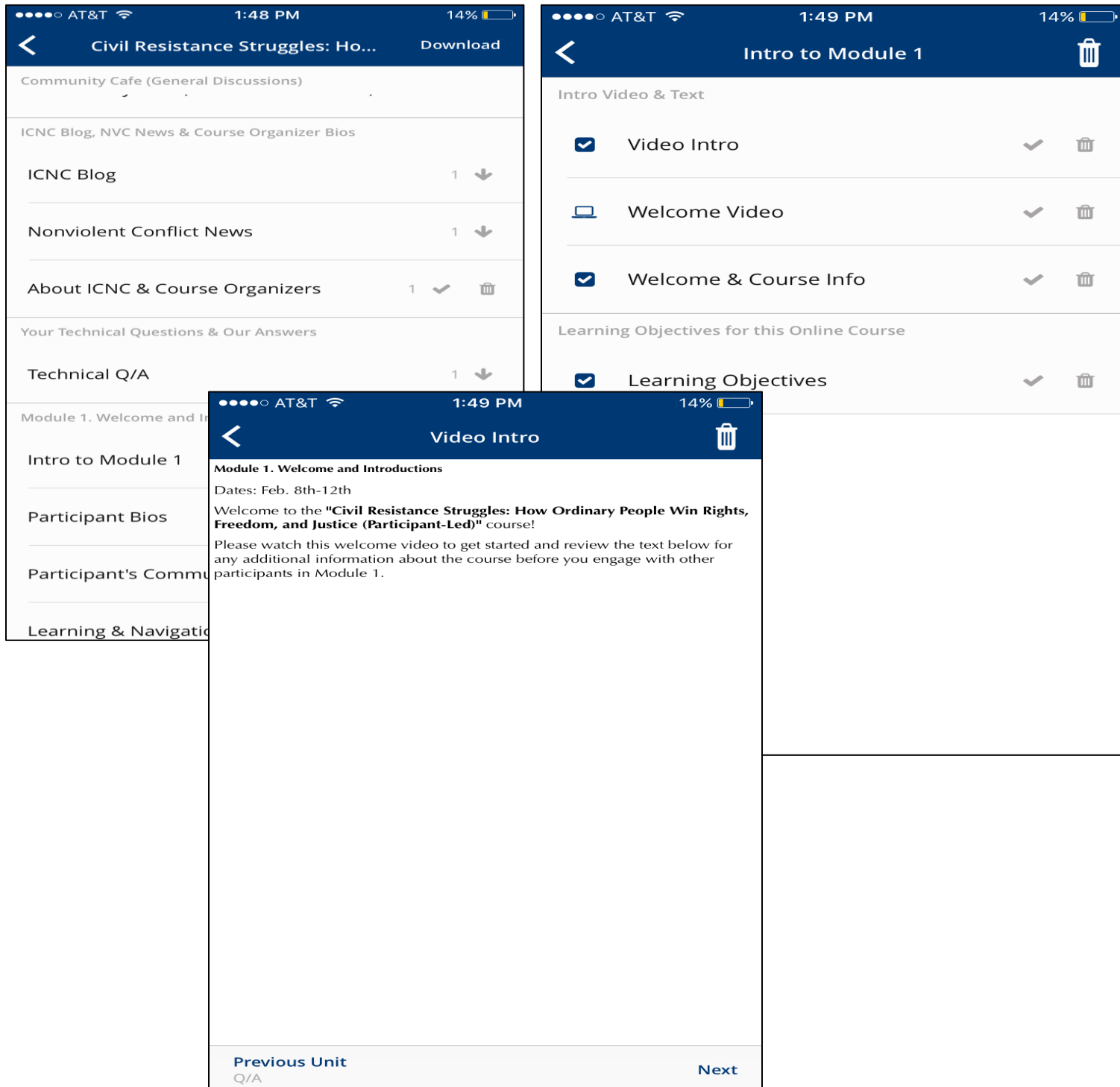


- iii. You can access all of the files you've downloaded In Downloaded Courses and Downloaded Files. These files are arranged by video and then all other units.



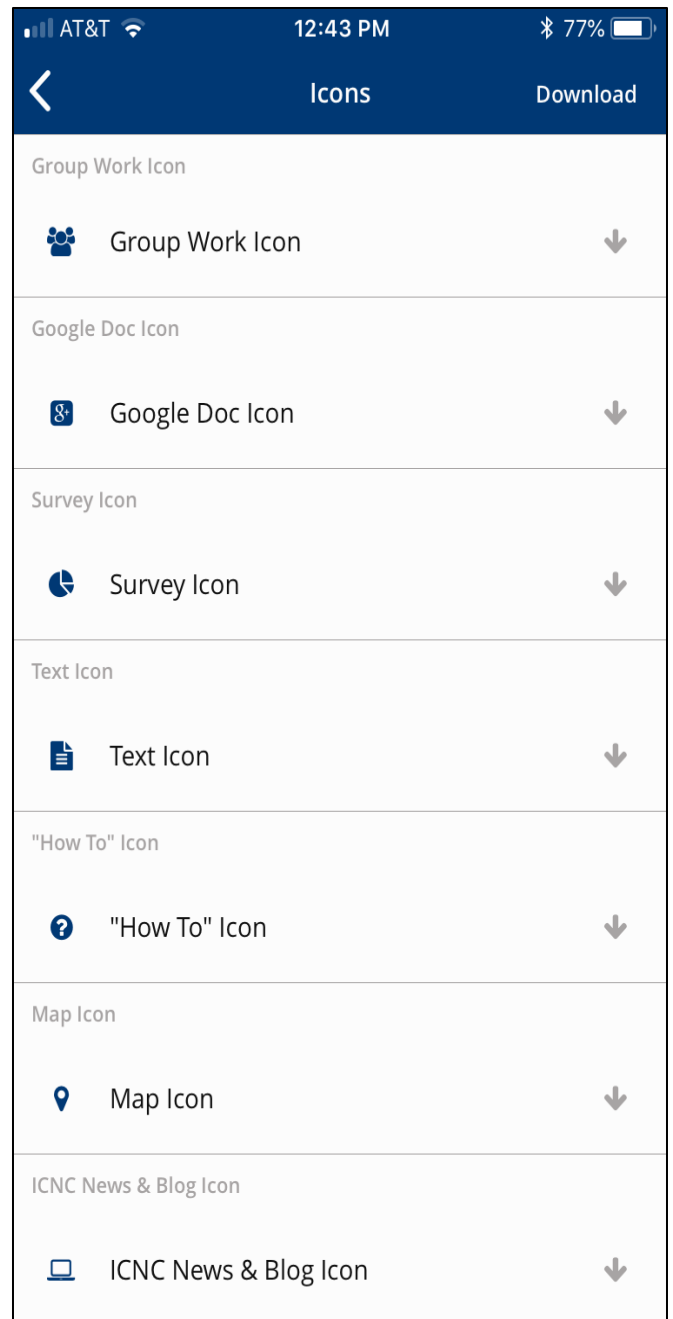
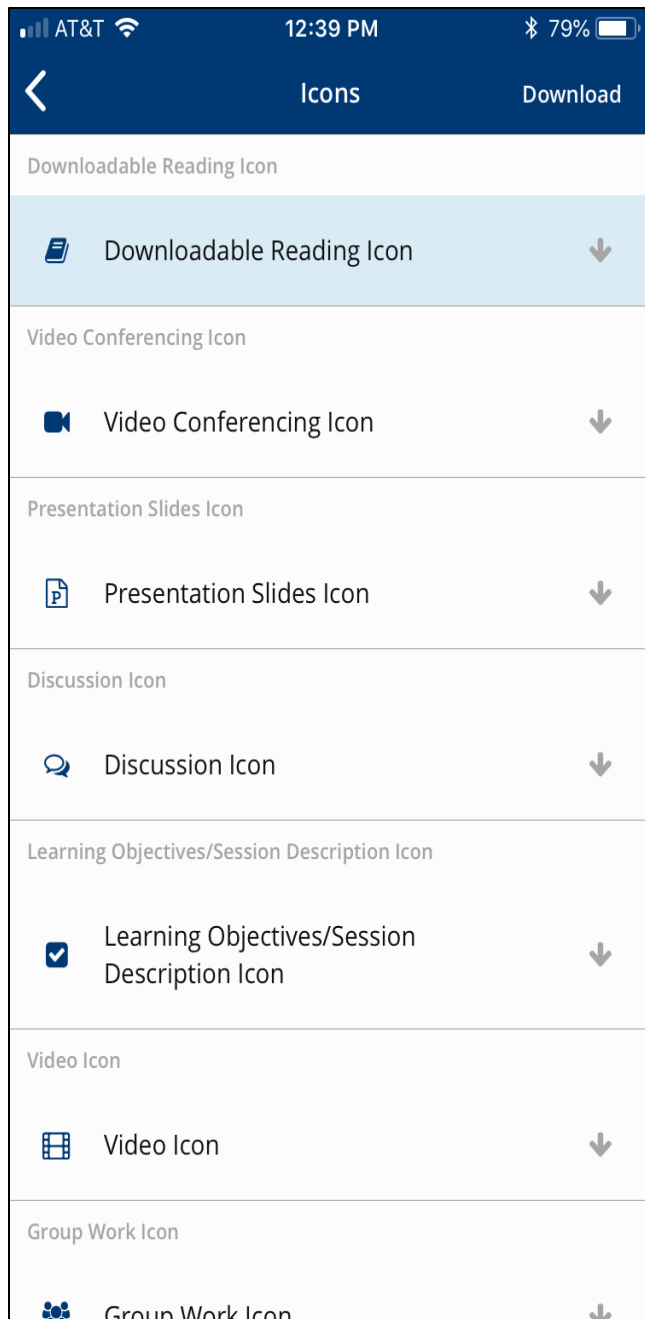
- **Deleting content**

- Users can delete content from the course, section, and unit level. To delete content, tap on the garbage can icon next to a section or unit. You will see a pop up message confirming that you want to delete those files. Tap “OK” to delete. Deleted content can always be downloaded again later.



VII. **Icon Legend**

- Icons are displayed next to icons to help users navigate the mobile app. Please use the screenshots below as a reference point for the different icons you'll see in the mobile app.
- Downloadable Reading Icon-units with this icon will primarily contain additional reading resources
- Video Conferencing Icon-units with this icon will contain links for the user to enter a video conference. These will primarily be small group units.
- Presentation Slides Icon-units with this icon will primarily contain powerpoint presentations
- Discussion Icon-units with this icon will contain discussion forums for users to make new posts and reply to other discussion posts
- Learning Objectives/Session Description Icon-units with this icon will contain learning objectives and a brief description of that session.
- Video Icon-units with this icon will primarily contain videos (such as youtube videos)
- Group Work Icon-units with this icon will primarily contain instructions for small group assignments
- Google Doc Icon-units with this icon primarily contain a Google Document where users can work collaboratively on an assignment. Google Docs cannot be edited within the ICNC mobile app.
- Survey Icon-units with this icon primarily contain surveys for the user to complete and submit. These surveys can be completed within the ICNC mobile app.
- Text Icon-units with this icon primarily contain written text.
- "How To" Icon-units with this icon primarily contain instructions on how to use the ICNC platform, mobile app, and other instructions.
- Map Icon-units with this icon contain a map where users can add their locations.
- ICNC News & Blog Icon-units with this icon contain either ICNC Minds of the Movement Blog or ICNC's Nonviolent Conflict News.
