
3-Month Follow-Up Report



1. In the last three months, how have you primarily applied the knowledge from the course? You may select more than one option















6. Since the completion of the course, how interested are you in learning more about civil resistance?




7. In comparison to before the online course, how often did you use the tools below in the past three months as part of your civil resistance training, education or actions?

8. As a result of the course, how skillful do you believe you have been in leading and planning a civil resistance campaign over the last three months?12 responses







10. If you are currently participating in a civil resistance campaign, how effective have you been in achieving your campaign's stated objectives over the last three months? 8 responses





- I have been involved in students leaders campaign and election monitoring for female students at the university and overall students election campaigns and its been quite successful
- I've not participated in a civil resistance action within the last three months, but I've been reconnecting and connecting with activist friends more often as compared to before.
- Our Local was able to successfully bargain a contract with over 20% pay increase and other benefits and protections due to a significant increase in worker engagement. While unions are not illegal in the United States, a large majority of our members are international student workers who have their student worker visa held over their heads by supervisors and administrators frequently to keep them from speaking up about terrible working conditions. We were able to help move many people past the fear of losing their visa and ability to complete their degree and won a huge victory.


- I am involved in an civil disobedience on boycotting corporate entities in Uganda and more so creating online petitions about the human rights violations happening there.

It has helped those in my life to think about conflict in a new way, ask more questions about conflict, and reconsider the effectiveness of violence as a tactic.



- We have just started a new programme in Future Studies (with UNED in Spain). We are linking the background in anticipation, prediction, planning to desired futures and activism as a mean to achieve those desired futures
- Petition crafting. I learned to craft effective petitions from the course and now I am maximizing on the People Power Course.
- Training about the need for the above category to be involved in the peacebuilding process. Assessment of failures of existing peace architecture in the community. Application of SMART to what these categories bring to the fore in terms of peace
- Strategy for advocacy for protecting the civic space in Nigeria ahead of the 2023 elections






